Sports WSC Tickets Selling Fast

PULLMAN (AP) — The break up of the Pacific Coast Conference has no apparent effect on the desire of fans to watch the Washington State Cougars in action, according to Stan Bates, director of athletics.

"Our season ticket sales already have topped the record for any single year in our history and we are hoping to set an all-time attendance mark this fall for the four games we will play in the Palouse country," Bates said Wednesday.

Lead by quarterback Bob Newman, the nation's total offense leader last year, the All-America end candidate Bill Steiger, coach Jim Sutherland's Cougars are rated one of the top teams on the coast this year. About 27 lettersmen will be out for fall practice which gets under way Sept. 1.

WSC opens the season against Stanford here Sept. 20. They play Oregon State here Nov. 4, USC and Washington in Spokane Oct. 25 and Nov. 22 respectively.

The West named co-captains Wednesday, picking four players to lead it into the game: Leroy Noffsinger of Yencalla, Bill Peterson of Powers, Don Smith of Nahnalem and Dennis Codd of Tillamook.

Akins Needs 10th-Round KO To Win

CHICAGO (AP) — Welterweight champion Virgil Akins saved face last night with a 10th-round technical knockout of hardy Charlie (Tombstone) Smith.

He didn't have much face to save.

Smith, a gangling 4-1 underdog, opened cuts at the corner of Akins' eyes. By the 10th of the nationally televised show, the champ's face was a crimson mask.

The end came suddenly for Smith, eighth-ranking contender from Los Angeles. Tombstone had a big lead on all official cards as he christened the rusty Akins with long, popping lefts and digging rights.

In the 10th round, Akins charged Smith furiously at the bell and pummeled him with rights and lefts.

A left hook decked Tombstone for an eight count. He arose fog-bound.

Then Akins drove him into a corner. He landed 16 rights and lefts without Tombstone fighting back. Referee Frank Sikora stopped it at 1:18.

The crowd of 862 booed and threw some trash into the ring. "I'll admit I was a little dazed," said Tombstone afterwards. "But they shouldn't have stopped it. I knew all I had to do was last it out to win. I think I could have done it."

Northeast Oregon mountain lakes and river mouths along the coast offer the best bets for week-end catches the commission said.

Summer steelhead angling is fair to good in the Steamboat area with best results in early morning or late afternoon. Lemolo, Tokete and Soda Springs Reservoirs are fair for trout. Salmon angling is good at Winchester Bay. The lower tidewater areas of the Umpqua River are excellent for striped bass. Chinook angling is fair to good on the lower Coquille River. Stripper and salmon fishing is fair at Coos Bay. Nearly all parts of the Rogue River basin are slow for trout with no improvement expected until cooler weather.
