LONDON (AP)—David and Goliath met again in battle this week. Goliath is a 1,200-pound bull charged through two barbed wire fences and terrorized 18 children.

David is 43-pound David Butler, a tough little 4-year-old who like his Biblical namesake refused to give ground.

They met in a playing field at Slyfield Green, Surrey.

David was playing on the swings when the big black bullock charged snorting into the field. All but David ran screaming from his path.

"I got a stick and hit the bull and said 'Shoo,'" David said.

"The bull just stood still when I hit him. So I hit him again. He stamped his feet. So I hit him again."

That was enough for Goliath the bullock. He turned and fled. Today Goliath's days were numbered. He was grazing again in a field not far from a local slaughterhouse.

The conferees eliminated funds for seven water projects carrying a total of \$1,225,000. They had been added to the bill while it was pending in the Senate.

The Siuslaw project was listed for \$30,000.
