Yakima blanked Tri-City Thursday night to stretch its Northwest League lead to four games over second place Wenatchee, which lost to Eugene.

The Bears may need every game they can get. They travel to Wenatchee Friday night for a four-game series.

The Bears overcame the Braves, 9-0, while Eugene's Emeralds were lacking a 2-1 defeat on the Chiefs. Lewiston dumped Salem's last place Senators, 5-2, in the other league tilt Thursday.

Three-run homers by Don Gatus and Herm Lewis' clout over the left-center wall in the first inning.

Gatus' homer came in the fourth.

The two clouts made it easy for the Bears' Bob Cleboski to rack up his 18th victory in 23 tries. Cleboski struck out eight, walked one and held the Braves to seven singles.

Don Dobrino, who worked the full route for the Braves, gave up only eight hits but walked three.

Bailey Brem won his 14th game by doing out three scattered hits to the Emeralds. Brem has lost eight.

One of the blows off the lanky Wenatchee right-hander was a fifth inning homerun by Red Helms for the Chiefs' lone tally.

A double by Danny Holden scored Bill Eastburn and Ron Condon, both of whom had singled, for the Chiefs' two runs in the top of the ninth.

Win number 21 came Thornton "Kip" Kipper's way at Lewiston as he led the Broncos past Salem.

Kip gave up 11 hits but all were singles and, except for the second inning, the right-hander kept the Senators' hits well scattered.

Salem scored its only runs in the second on an error, singles by Jerry Greg, Twink Pederson and LeRoy Johnson, whose bloop-er drove in both tallies.

Bruce McIntosh led Lewiston hitters with two triples and a single in four times up.

With Yakima at Wenatchee in

a crucial weekend series, the other changes will find Eugene at Salem and Tri-City at Lewiston. All are four-game series.

SALEM (AP)—The 35th annual Oregon State horseshoe pitching tournament will be held at Bush Pasture Park here this coming weekend.

Nineteen of an expected field of 40 have qualified with Eldon Harvey of Canby the top point-getter so far. He ran up 128 points in qualifying with a ringer average of 80 per cent. Harvey was state champion in 1956.

Five other former champions are competing: Roy Getchell of Portland, Otto Johnson of Portland, Cletus Chapelle of Portland, Irving Schaumburg of Portland, Barney Hampton of Portland. Also competing will be Bob West of McMinnville, the defending champion.

More Than 2,000 Shooters Compete For Big Trap Title

Carrying 130 pounds, the millionaire champion will spot up to 14 to such candidates as Hoop Band, Meeting, Clem, Bernburgoo, Jack Ketch, St. Vincent, Clermont and Rajputana.
