Low Bids Listed On Dam Project On Crooked River

PRINEVILLE (AP)—The Keystone Construction Co., a subsidiary of the Hudspeith interests of Prineville, was apparent low bidder for construction of a Bureau of Reclamation dam on the Crooked River.

Bids were opened this week at the Crook County Courthouse here. The Keystone company submitted a bid of \$2,614,943 for the 80 separate items in the dam contract. Second apparent low of the 17 bids was by the Rogers Construction Co., Portland, \$2,990,096.50.

Peter Kiewit and Sons, Medford, submitted a third low bid of \$3,066,947. The Bureau of Reclamation estimate was \$2,933,253. The dam is to be built on the Crooked River 21 miles south of Prineville and will create a lake approximately 15 miles long. Construction will take about two and a half years, according to W. L. Karrer, construction engineer with the bureau in Prineville. The contract will be awarded in about two weeks.
