

# Roseburg School Attendance Areas Outlined

Attendance areas of the Roseburg elementary schools have been outlined by Supt. M. C. Deller. Most boundary lines are determined by the number of students living in that area and are subject to change when the total enrollment is greater in one attendance area than another. The attendance area for each school follows.

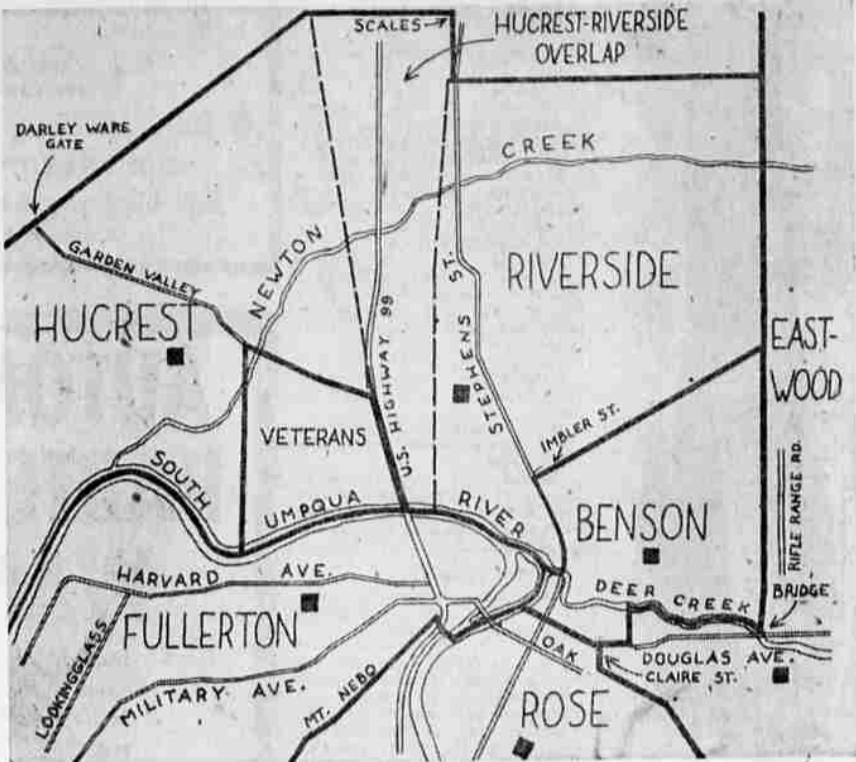
**Benson:** The south boundary of the Benson attendance area is the center of SE Douglas Avenue as far east as SE Claire Street where the boundary turns north to Deer Creek and follows Deer Creek to the Deer Creek bridge.

The eastern boundary of the Benson attendance area is an imaginary line drawn from Deer Creek bridge due north through Gardner Street and Rifle Range Road. On the west side of the Benson area the boundary line is an imaginary line west of Stephens Street to NE Imbler Avenue. This area includes all children living on NE Prospect and Bellview. The north boundary line follows the center of Imbler Street and eastward to a point above the end of NE Lincoln Street, Kinney Drive and Arrowhead Avenue.

**Eastwood:** The western boundary of the Eastwood attendance area lies on Deer Creek south on the east side of Claire Street to SE Douglas Avenue thence eastward to the Catholic cemetery and then southward. The southern boundary encompasses SE Rust and Leand Streets, Colorado Drive, Eastwood Street, Ramp Street and follows an imaginary line from Ramp Street eastward to the east boundary of the school district. The north boundary line of Eastwood is an imaginary point on Deer Creek between Claire and Bush Streets. It follows down the center of Deer Creek eastward to the Deer Creek bridge on Douglas Avenue. The boundary line turns north and parallels Rifle Range Road on the west.

**Rose:** The north boundary of the Rose attendance area is the center of Douglas Avenue and East Douglas Avenue to a point eastward to the Catholic cemetery. The west boundary of the Rose area is the center of the Umpqua River starting at a point where Deer Creek empties into the Umpqua on the north. It follows the river south to the city limits near Nielsen's Market. The eastern boundary is the city limits and includes extensions of Summit Street and Illinois Avenue. The southern boundary is the city limits on the south including pupils living on Strong Avenue and Icabod Street. All pupils living in the Umpqua Park and Fairgrounds area will also be transported to the Rose School. All first, second and third grade pupils living along Highway 99 BR south of Nielsen's Market and past Burton's Drive in to Kelley's Korner will attend Rose.

**Riverside:** The southeast boundary is an imaginary line running through the center of Imbler Street to a point southwest including all the area north of College Drive and north of Imbler Street. The eastern boundary is an imaginary line east of the Cloverdale addition, east of the Newton Creek housing area. The northern boundary is north of Housley Avenue. It includes pupils living west of Highway 99 in the area of the old highway scales and in the Sweetbrier

zone on both sides of Highway 99. The western boundary is Highway 99 starting in the area of General Avenue south to the new bridge over the Umpqua River just north of the high school.

An exception is the first and second grade pupils living in the zone between the railroad track and Highway 99 and first and second grade pupils in the Sweetbrier area who will attend the Hucrest School.

**Hucrest:** The eastern boundary of the Hucrest area is Highway 99 north of the Umpqua River to the overpass near the municipal airport. The southern boundary begins at the Cloverleaf on Garden Valley Boulevard extends westward to Calkins Road. The boundary then turns south on the east side of Calkins Road and goes south to the Umpqua at the end of Keasey Street. The boundary line then turns westward and follows the river to a point west of "private road." The western boundary of the Hucrest area extends from the Darley Ware gate due south to the Umpqua River. The northern boundary begins at the Ware gate. It extends eastward to the Roseburg Municipal Airport overpass on Highway 99. This includes NW Dogwood, Estelle, Crouch and Gertz streets.

**Fullerton:** Beginning at the Oak Street bridge, the boundary of the Fullerton area follows the Umpqua River northward around the bend then westward to Rocky Point on the Melrose Road. Pupils living at Veterans Administration Hospital will also attend Fullerton. The southern boundary of the Fullerton area extends from Kelley's Motel on the east and follows the Nebo Ridge including Military Avenue and west on W. Military Avenue and up Lookingglass Road to the southwest boundary of the school district.

**Green:** All pupils living south of the city limits, with the exception of the first, second and third graders living along Highway 99 BR to the Winston bridge will attend the Green School.

**Riversdale-Garden Valley:** All first and second grade pupils of these two areas will attend the Riverside School.

**Melrose:** Pupils living west of Rocky Point on Melrose Road will attend the Melrose School.

**Wilbur-Winchester:** The southern boundary of the Wilbur-Winchester area is NE Housley Avenue. All first and second grade pupils of the Wilbur-Winchester area will attend the Winchester School. All third grade pupils living between Housley Street and Winchester bridge will attend the Wilbur School. Fourth, fifth and sixth grade pupils will attend the Wilbur School.

**Central Junior High School:** Seventh and eighth grade pupils who live in the Rose, Benson and Fullerton areas will attend Central.

**Joseph Lane Junior High School:** Seventh graders from Wilbur-Winchester, Garden Valley-Riversdale, Hucrest, Riverside, Green and the Umpqua Park areas will attend Joseph Lane.

## Pair Saying They Were Gun Targets Sue For Damages

PORTLAND (AP)—Two men who said they were fired at near Independence, Ore., last month, sued the operators of Sunset Farms of Independence today for \$111,200. They said one of the operators hit them in the legs with rifle bullets.

Lewis Paul Hayes of Tardko, Mo., asked for \$71,850 and Fred L. Tibbett of Homedale, Idaho, asked for \$39,350 in their suits filed in U. S. District Court here.

They said they were in a car at which Glenn Hardin, one of the farm operators, fired several rifle shots, hitting them in the legs. They said there had been trouble among transient laborers working in the bean harvest and they were mistakenly identified in it.

Glenn and Roland H. Hardman, the farm operators, are the defendants.

At the time of the shooting Hayes was working for the Hardmans as a field hand and Tibbett was employed at a sawmill near by.

## Money Allotted To Fight Oregon's Horde Of Rabbits

SALEM (AP)—Money to fight a buildup of rabbits in Eastern Oregon was appropriated by the state Emergency Board Friday.

It approved spending up to \$7,000 to fight the infestation of the animals in the region between the Harney Valley and the Idaho state line.

The rabbits have been reported moving from the high desert country into irrigated lands in large numbers.

Potential health danger from the rabbits, which sometimes carry diseases, was cited by the Emergency Board in approving the money.

Cash appropriated will be used to put out poison, J. R. Beck, Oregon State College, said. Beck is in charge of the fight on field mice which the state has undertaken.

At the Emergency Board meeting it was announced that \$61,000 of the \$100,000 appropriated by the Emergency Board to fight the field mouse epidemic last year would not be needed and is being returned to the state's emergency fund.

In other action the board approved grants of \$22,580 to the Board of Parole and Probation and \$20,000 to the state hospital to make up budget deficiencies.

A go-ahead was given by the board for construction of a dormitory at MacLaren School for Boys and a fish hatchery on Elk River. Both projects had been approved by the Legislature but need emergency board approval before money can be released to begin construction.

Dusting Plane Topples Radio Station Tower  
MEDFORD (AP)—A low-flying crop dusting plane hit a guy wire on a radio station's transmitting tower just before 6 a. m. today. The 405-foot tower toppled to the ground. The plane returned to the airport undamaged.

Vernon Ludwig, partner in the operation of station KDOV, said the tower was a total loss. He said damage would run to \$10,000 or \$12,000. Another tower will be up in two weeks or so, he said, and meanwhile a temporary tower will be used to get the station—which started broadcasting only Aug. 25—back on the air by early Saturday.

William E. Rosenbalm of Medford Air Service was spraying orchards along Bear Creek, south of the station. He was unhurt and officials at the air service said the plane was not damaged.

Ludwig said witnesses told him the plane hit the guy wire about 200 feet above the ground.

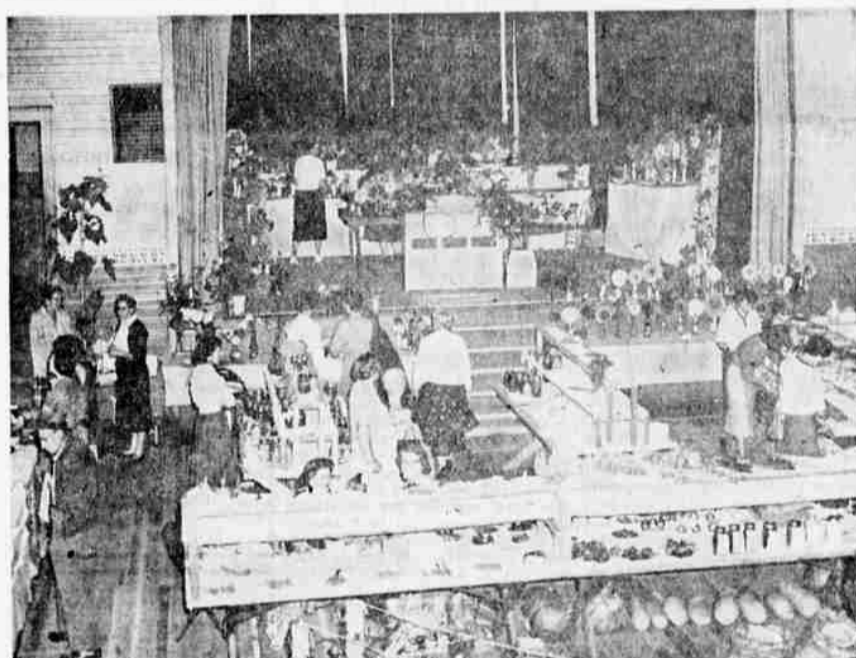

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## Pair Saying They Were Gun Targets Sue For Damages

PORTLAND (AP)—Two men who said they were fired at near Independence, Ore., last month, sued the operators of Sunset Farms of Independence today for \$111,200. They said one of the operators hit them in the legs with rifle bullets.

Lewis Paul Hayes of Tardko, Mo., asked for \$71,850 and Fred L. Tibbett of Homedale, Idaho, asked for \$39,350 in their suits filed in U. S. District Court here.

They said they were in a car at which Glenn Hardin, one of the farm operators, fired several rifle shots, hitting them in the legs. They said there had been trouble among transient laborers working in the bean harvest and they were mistakenly identified in it.

Glenn and Roland H. Hardman, the farm operators, are the defendants.

At the time of the shooting Hayes was working for the Hardmans as a field hand and Tibbett was employed at a sawmill near by.

## Money Allotted To Fight Oregon's Horde Of Rabbits

SALEM (AP)—Money to fight a buildup of rabbits in Eastern Oregon was appropriated by the state Emergency Board Friday.

It approved spending up to \$7,000 to fight the infestation of the animals in the region between the Harney Valley and the Idaho state line.

The rabbits have been reported moving from the high desert country into irrigated lands in large numbers.

Potential health danger from the rabbits, which sometimes carry diseases, was cited by the Emergency Board in approving the money.

Cash appropriated will be used to put out poison, J. R. Beck, Oregon State College, said. Beck is in charge of the fight on field mice which the state has undertaken.

At the Emergency Board meeting it was announced that \$61,000 of the \$100,000 appropriated by the Emergency Board to fight the field mouse epidemic last year would not be needed and is being returned to the state's emergency fund.

In other action the board approved grants of \$22,580 to the Board of Parole and Probation and \$20,000 to the state hospital to make up budget deficiencies.

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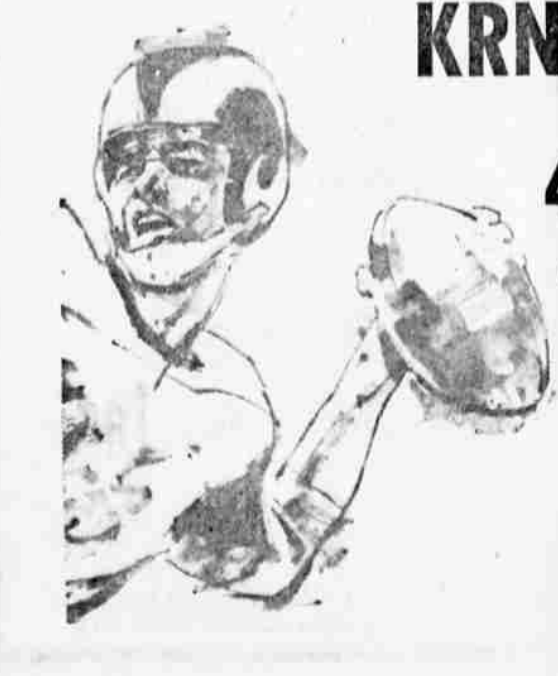
