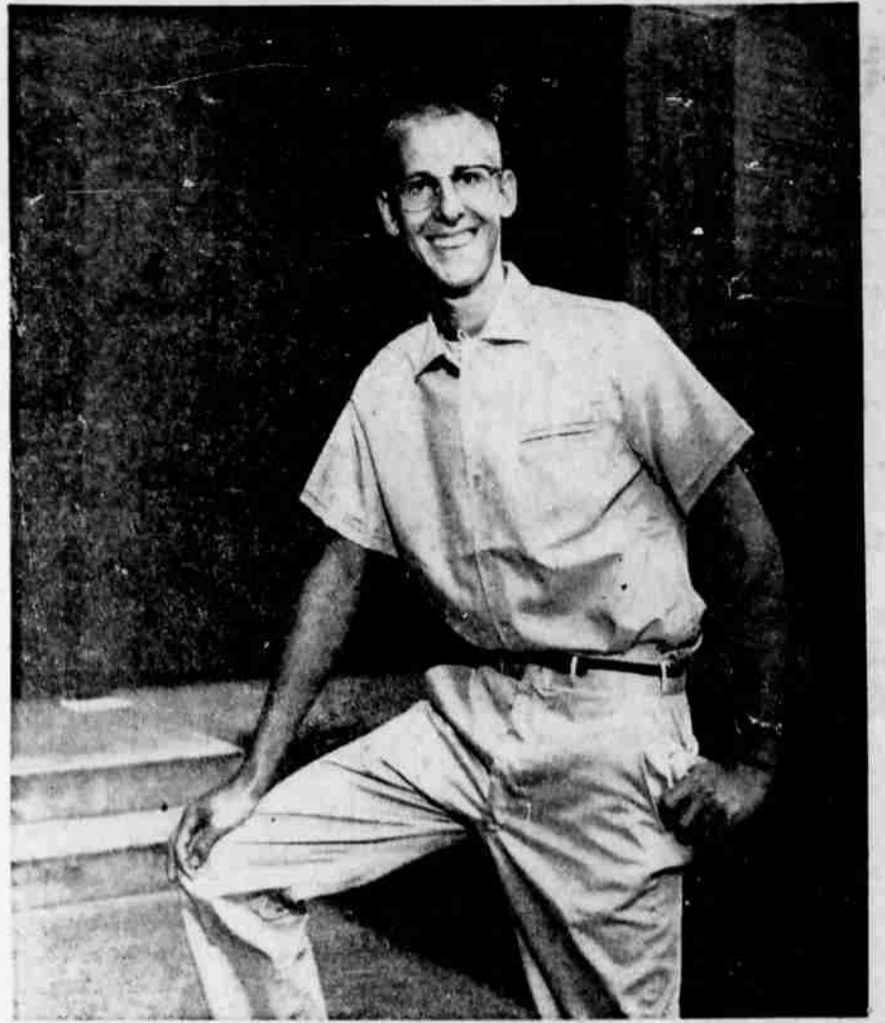




Leave For College
