

# Plans To Build 2 Nuclear Plants In Alaska Revealed

ANCHORAGE, Alaska (AP)—Plans for construction of two nuclear power plants to be built at government installations in Alaska were revealed Tuesday by Washington's Gov. Albert Rosellini.

Here on a goodwill tour, the governor told a Chamber of Commerce luncheon his information came from unofficial but "thoroughly reliable" sources. He said the information was not classified but that location of the plants was secret.

## Oil Transport Costly

"I understand it costs about 20 cents a gallon to fly oil to the bases, making it economically feasible to build nuclear power plants," Rosellini said.
