

# New Freedom Doesn't Please Guinea

PARIS (AP)—"We want a free and dignified marriage and not divorce," said the troubled President of newly independent Guinea.

"We don't want independence against France, but rather with her," the handsome, black-suited Negro leader explained to a reporter in his distant capital at Conakry.

Results of the Sept. 28 French constitutional referendum from the rain-swept tropical country side showed a margin of 40-1 against Gen. Charles de Gaulle's constitution.

Sekou Toure, a former French trading company junior clerk whose ancestors helped found the 13th century African Mali Empire,

had told his followers to vote "No."

## Veteran State Policemen Called Up Before Board

MILWAUKIE (AP) — Veteran state policeman Robert Wampler has been ordered to appear before a disciplinary board and State Rep. Richard Groener (D-Milwaukee) said the action stems from criticism of a quota arrest system.

Groener recently demanded that State Police Supt. H. G. Maison be fired because of an order which he said required all state policemen to make a certain number of traffic arrests.

At the time Groener made his demand he said he had proof to back up his charge that the quota arrest system was in effect.

Groener said Tuesday that Wampler was not involved in the accusations he had made against Maison but that Maison had probably thought he was because the patrolman had accompanied Groener to the governor's office when the accusation first was made.

Maison—who will neither confirm nor deny that a quota arrest system is in effect—said that Groener's accusations were not the basis for action against Wampler. "There is no member of this department under fire for the statements made by Groener. Any member of this department under disciplinary action is brought under this action by just cause," Maison said.

Wampler also denied he had anything to do with Groener's accusations. He said he had been called before Maison who told him he would face written charges before a board composed of a superintendent and two captains of the state police.

Groener said this would be a "kangaroo court."

## WCTU Children's Home Objectives, Achievements Told

The objectives and accomplishments of the WCTU Children's Home near Corvallis were outlined Tuesday noon by the Rev. Walter Frutiger, religious education director there. He spoke to the Roseburg Kiwanis Club in the Umpqua Hotel.

The talk was illustrated with colored slides. Later in the day, he showed the slides and talked at the First Presbyterian Church, where the WCTU county convention was in progress.

The Rev. Mr. Frutiger said many of the children are dependents referred to the farm home by courts throughout the state.

Residents in this area are supporters of the home, he pointed out. The home, a member of the Oregon United Appeal, which in turn is a member of the Central Douglas United Fund.

Other funds come from state aid to dependent children and donations by lodges, clubs, churches and individuals.

The home, which has a capacity of 146 children, is caring for 110 now.

The Rev. Mr. Frutiger was introduced by the Rev. Alfred S. Tyson, rector of St. George's Episcopal Church.

The Rev. Fr. Tyson, a member of the Douglas County Employ the Physically Handicapped Committee, told the club that hiring handicapped persons isn't charity, but sound economics, since those persons usually produce better than the non-handicapped.
