

Eugene, Medford Meetings Set For Woodlot Owners

Meetings in Eugene and Medford have been scheduled to review forestry problems for small woodlot owners.

The meetings will be conducted by the U. S. Forest Service and state Forestry Department, with local public agencies co-operating. The Eugene meeting will be Oct. 14 at 1:30 p.m. in the conference room of the Eugene Register-Guard. The Medford conference will be at 1 p.m. the following day at the Jackson County Fair grounds.

They are two of a series of meetings to be held over the state. A state-wide meeting will be Nov. 6 in Salem, when views of forestry practices will be recorded for study. Later, recommendations will be made to the Forest Service as aid in setting up a national program to improve production of small woodlands.

Jack Mace, Medford, service forester for the state Forestry Department, said half of the 10 million acres of privately owned commercial forest lands in Oregon are in small ownerships. The small acreages, however, are producing only about half the timber they should.

Three keynote subjects are to be discussed at the meeting, according to Harold Sasser, state farm forester, Eugene. They are:

1. Future demands for forest products from the small forest.
2. Forestry management to make a woodland fully productive.
3. Progress in programs, both public and private, aimed at assisting the owner of small forest tracts.

The Eugene conference is for woodland owners in Northern Douglas County; the Medford meeting for those from southern Douglas.

Small forest owners are regarded to be those with between 10 and 8,000 acres.
