Bill Marsters and John Hakanson, Canyonville school principals, attended the classes in IBM machine grading at the county superintendent's office Tuesday.

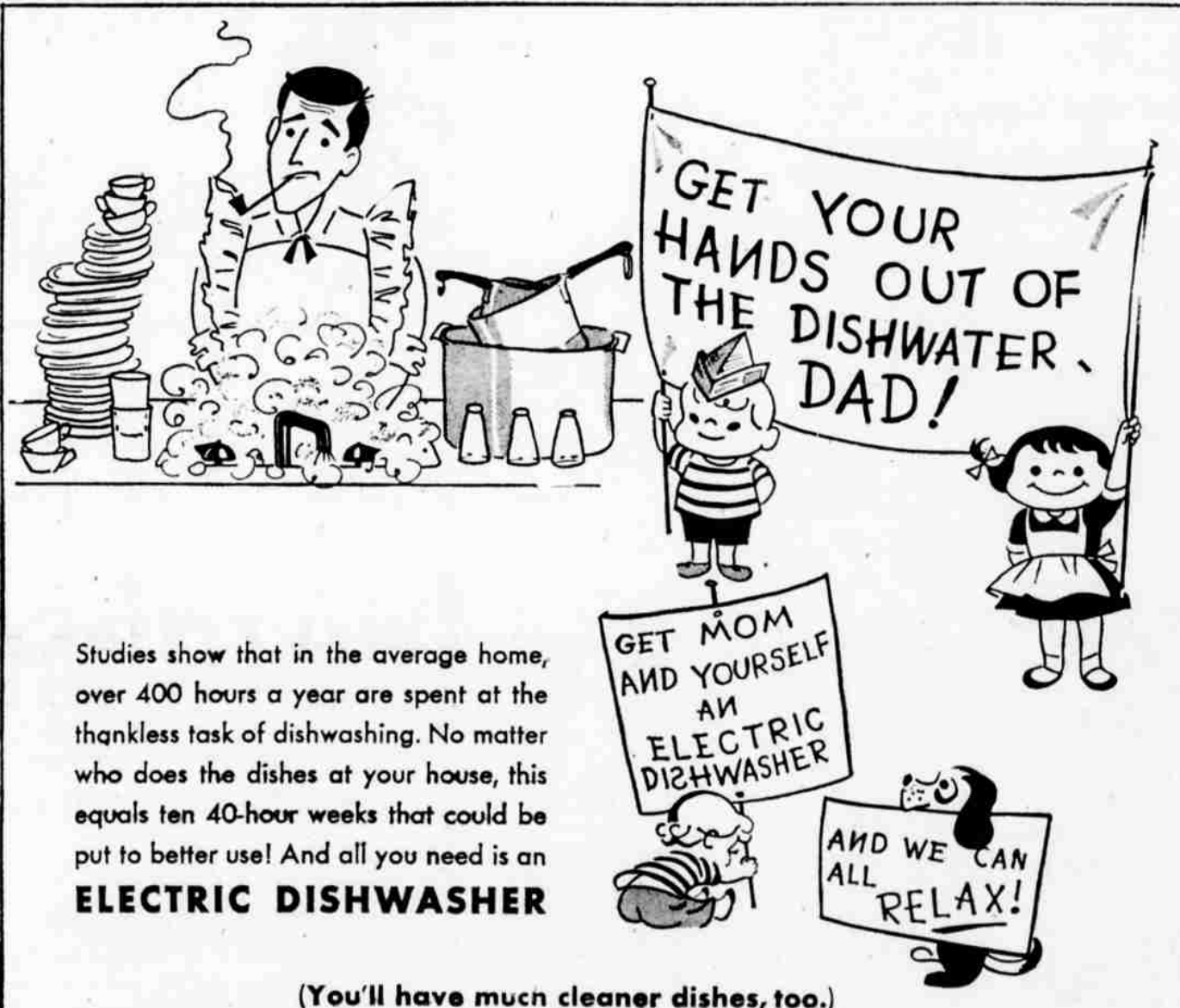

Chuck Hamlin was working on over 10, with those from Canyonville brought in by Frank Dieckgraft and Lucille Boyd.

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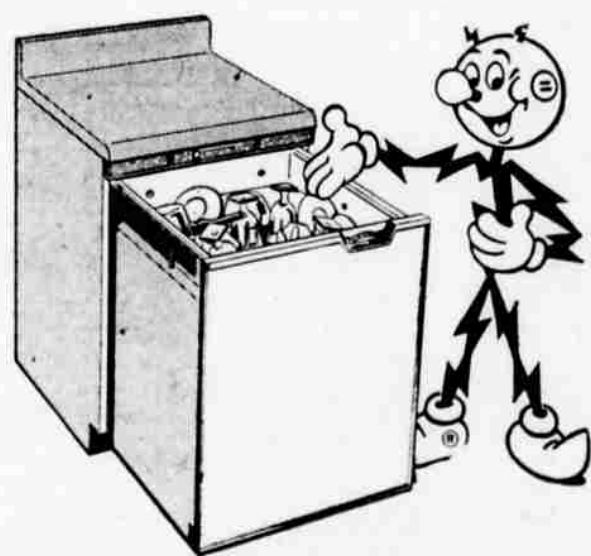
