

Unemployment Drops 588,000 In September, Report Says

WASHINGTON (AP)—Unemployment dropped by 588,000 in September, marking what the government called a significant improvement in the job situation.

The joint monthly report of the Commerce and Labor Departments said unemployment declined from 4,689,000 in August to 4,101,000 in September.

This was about twice the usual seasonal decline between August and September.

Employment also dropped, falling from 65,587,000 to 64,479,000 or a decline of 1,108,000. This is usual as students go back to school at this time of year.

About one million students quit summer jobs to return to classes this year.

Weeks Comments

Secretary of Commerce Weeks and Secretary of Labor Mitchell said:

"A sharp pickup among adult men in nonfarm activities was chiefly responsible for reducing the unemployed total to its lowest level for the year thus far. Hiring was especially brisk in automobile plants and steel mills, and among producers of home appliances. In addition, there was the usual expansion in school staffs."

An early autumn lull in farm activity, as well as the customary September withdrawal of students from the labor market, contributed toward the decline in employment.

The seasonally adjusted rate of unemployment fell to 7.3 per cent

BPA Has Plenty of Power But Not Enough Customers

PORTLAND (AP)—The Bonneville Power Administration said this week it has plenty of power, but not enough customers.

As a result, Bonneville Administrator William A. Pearl said, the big federal power agency is operating in the red this year and expects to continue doing so through 1959.

Pearl said Bonneville might have to raise its rates in the near future.

Pearl's report was one of several presented at Wednesday's meeting of the Columbia Basin Interagency Committee, a regional organization attempting to work out a water-use program.

Pearl said power use had fallen off because of mild weather and the recession.

Ray W. Scheufele of the Army Engineers reported that 90 million dollars will be spent in the Columbia basin in the current fiscal year.

Navigation, Flood Studies

This includes \$400,000 for navigation and flood control studies, two million for advance work on 17 projects, three million to begin construction on 11 new small projects, 70 million for continuing work on projects underway, and 144 million for operation and maintenance of present projects.

Ellis Hatt of the U.S. Department of Agriculture said that 1958 was the worst year for forest fires since 1951. There were 1,721 fires in Washington and Oregon through September and 17,396
