Freedom Fighters Held As Suspects In LA Burglary

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Two years ago they were battling the Russians in the Hungarian revolt. Today the three young Freedom Fighters are in jail, suspected of stealing \$30,000 worth of loot.

Csaba Tuti, 24, Andrew Sarossy, 20, and Frank Kertez, 19, were arrested Sunday breaking into a clothing store. Police said they had found \$20,000 worth of stolen goods in the refugees' home.

In broken English, Sarossy told how the trio's pursuit of the American dream had foundered on the installment plan during the 17 months since they entered the country.

"We couldn't make the payments on a car and our furniture," he said. "I wanted money to go to school. I wanted to get an education at any price."

All three had jobs, Sarossy said, but found it impossible to keep up with payments of \$110 a month for a new car and \$67 a month for furniture in the comfortable house they share in suburban Glendale. He also needed money to enroll as a cinema student at the University of Southern California, he said.

Officers said the three had confessed stealing more than \$30,000 worth of objects from jewelry, camera, and clothing stores. The remains of 15 pay telephones which had been ripped off and broken open were found on a hill behind their home.

All were booked on suspicion of burglary.

Democrat Council Says Formosa Issue Should Go To U. N.
WASHINGTON (AP) — Criticizing the administration's handling of the Formosa crisis, the Democratic Advisory Council says the problem should be submitted to the United Nations.

The 24-member council said in a weekend statement that the Eisenhower administration has "led us to the brink of isolation from our allies and to the brink of having to fight a nuclear war inadequately prepared and alone."

GOP National Chairman Meade Alcorn took an opposite view, saying "peace with the Republicans, or a possible war," is one of the choices the voters face in the Nov. 4 elections for control of Congress. He said this and other issues have been pointed up by Vice President Nixon.

The Democratic council said this nation should join others in asking the United Nations for recommendations to:

Present Aggression
"1. Secure and stabilize the whole Formosa area in such a way as to prevent aggression from any source in any direction."
"2. Secure to the people on Formosa the right to determine their own future."

The fight between the Nationalists and Chinese Communists, the council said, is a problem of long-term relations that cannot be solved immediately.

Meantime a Democratic Congress, it said, must "see to it that the orderly processes of government are not replaced by the day-to-day whims of a world-ambulating secretary of state, and that policy decisions lacking wide domestic support—and wholly without Allied support—do not bring upon mankind a nuclear holocaust."

The statements of the Democratic council and of GOP Chairman Alcorn had the effect of trying to label each other's party a war party.

Alcorn mentioned the possible war as one of three issues he said Nixon has mentioned in campaign speeches. The others are:

"Solvency with the Republicans, or likely higher taxes."
"Freedom with the Republicans, or probable regimentation under alien conceptions of economics and government."

British Airman Held In Leak Of Rocket Secrets
LONDON (AP)—The Air Ministry said today a British airman is being held in connection with a suspected leak of rocket secrets.

An announcement named the man as Senior Aircraftman M. J. Brown, formerly stationed at Edinburgh Field near Britain's rocket testing base at Woomera, Australia.

The Air Ministry did not say to whom secrets were leaked. But a London newspaper, The Daily Mail, reported that investigators had arrested Brown after checking on reports that secrets from Woomera were getting into Soviet hands.

It was from Woomera that Britain's first space rocket, the Black Knight, was fired five weeks ago.

Edinburgh Field is an airstrip where equipment and supplies for Woomera are flown in. It is a highly secret zone, and the only persons allowed in are trusted scientists and technicians and servicemen on special assignments.

Brown was reported to have been arrested in Australia and then flown to Britain.

State, Federal Forest Officials Set Meetings

SALEM (AP) — Five meetings will be conducted by state and federal forest officials to help owners in managing small tracts of timber lands, state Forester Dwight L. Phipps announced today.

Phipps said that half of Oregon's 10 million acres of privately owned timber is in the small ownerships. Phipps added that these small owners are producing only about half of the timber they should.

Pishing Boat Hits Jetty; 1 Drowned, Other Saved

SEATTLE (AP) — A fishing boat struck a jetty in a heavy fog and sank at the mouth of the stormy Columbia River Saturday night. One man aboard was washed to shore and safety but his companion drowned.

Rudolph R. Rautio, 65, Portland, made his way to the Cape Disappointment lifeboat station after daybreak Sunday. He had been washed ashore on the north jetty, the Coast Guard reported here.

The body of his half brother, Toivo W. Mattson, 59, who lived at the same Portland address, was found a short time later.

Rautio said their 36-footer hit the jetty about 8:20 p.m. Saturday while running up the coast from Tillamook Head. He said he last saw Mattson floating away on a piece of wreckage.

Top Political Leaders Seized In Pakistan Rift

KARACHI, Pakistan. (AP) — Dozens of political leaders, including three former Cabinet ministers and three top leaders of the left-wing National Awami Party have been jailed by Pakistan's revolutionary two-man government.

The arrests were described as a crackdown against corruption.

Arrested Sunday were Hamidul Haq Chowdry, former foreign and finance minister; Abdul Mansoor Ahmed, former commerce minister; and Abdul Khaleque, former works minister. Chowdry was in the Cabinet of ex-Premier Mohammed Ali, and the other two in the government of H. S. Suhrawardy.

The arrest of Maulana Abdul Hamid Bhashani in East Pakistan also completed the roundup of top leaders of NAP. Khan Abdul Ghafar Khan, the 75-year-old bearded Moslem known as the "Frontier Gandhi," and Ghulam Mohammed Syed of NAP were seized previously.

Bhashani, who visited President Gamal Abdel Nasser of the United Arab Republic last summer, had advocated Nasser-like policies for Pakistan. Khan has agitated for an independent border state for Pushtu-speaking peoples, and Syed wanted autonomy for the Sind district.

President Iskander Mirza and Gen. Mohammed Ayub Khan have been ruling under martial law since last Tuesday.

Western And Communist Dignitaries Honor Pope

BERLIN (AP) — Western and Communist dignitaries of this divided city today paid homage to the memory of Pope Pius XII at a pontifical requiem mass celebrated on the East-West sector border in the Church of St. Sebastian.

Berlin's Bishop Julius Döpfner reminded the congregation of the late pontiff's concern for oppressed Catholics in East Europe. His sermon was heard by representatives of the Communist East German regime as well as West German and allied officials.
