These two stalwarts, both in the prime of life, have just become grandparents. There was a time when that would signify decrepitude. But Art still maintains a strenuous TV schedule and can lick his grandchild's father, young Jack Linkletter, on the handball courts. As for Wayne, he remains one of the most vigorous and bravest heroes in the movie business.

Polaris Rocket Twists Crazy, Then Explodes

CAPE CANAVERAL, Fla. (AP) — A temperamental Polaris experimental rocket twisted crazily over the cape and exploded Wednesday when the missile was deliberately destroyed after an abortive launching.

No one was injured, but the impact caused a raging brush fire on an isolated section of the cape. The flames were whipped by winds as high as 35 miles an hour.

It was the second time in three weeks that this type 25-foot Navy missile had exploded shortly after launching. A Polaris was blown apart high over the cape Sept. 24, raining debris back on the launching area and in the Banana River at nearby Cocoa Beach.

IRISH DRAMATIST DIES

DUBLIN, Ireland (AP) — Dr. Lennox Robinson, Irish dramatist and a leading member of the Abbey Theater staff for 45 years, died Tuesday night. He was 72. His best-known plays included "The White Headed Boy," "The Lost Leader" and "Curtain Up."
