In recording the second win over the Trojans, the Indians saw Gary Sanders pace the field over the mile and one-eighth course. Sanders won over the Indians' Bob Eddy with a time of 9:39.

Ed Thompson, of the Trojans, placed third in the test while the Indians grabbed the next two places as Marv Patterson was fourth and George Ives fifth.

## Figures Reveal Most College Teams Are Retaining Placement

NEW YORK (AP) — Regardless of what other schools might think about it, the University of South Carolina undoubtedly would give a rousing vote for the new rule allowing a team to try for one or two points after scoring a touchdown.

The Gamecocks, with a 2-2 record, have scored five touchdowns and have added 10 points by means of three passes and two runs.

The National Collegiate Service Bureau figures show that 10 major college football teams have taken advantage of the rule to try for two points, and 14 of the more conservative teams have used only placements for the one point.

W. Va., Houston Successful  
West Virginia, with 20 extra points on 17 touchdowns, and Houston, with 19 on 16 touchdowns, have added the most extra points to date. Both have used a mixture of passing, running and kicking.

Nine schools have tried for two points after every touchdown they have scored. Washington State has passed or run after each of its 13 touchdowns, and College of Pacific has tried for two after each of its 12 touchdowns. The other teams which have gone all out for two points are Harvard, Holy Cross, Tulane, Furman, George Washington, Marquette and Oregon State.

## Either-Sex Deer Season Called Off By Commission

Oregon deer hunters are reminded that there is no general either-sex deer hunt in 1958 following the buck season as there has been for the past several years.

Hunters holding general deer tags are restricted to hunting buck deer only during the entire season, Oct. 4-26. This reminder was issued by the Game Commission when it was learned that many deer hunters are under the impression that a general either-sex deer hunt would automatically follow the buck season.

This year for the first time a deer management unit system was established and a quota set for each unit for taking antlerless deer. Only those hunters who applied and received a unit permit will be allowed to take an antlerless animal during Oct. 18-26. Permit holders must hunt within the unit for which the permit was issued. #### 14,000 Salmon Moved Around Oxbow Dam Site

PORTLAND (AP)—Some 14,000 salmon and steelhead have been transported around the Idaho Power Co.'s Oxbow Dam site on the Snake River, a fishery agency says.

Edward Perry of the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service also reported, however, that some 3,500 of the migrating fish had died at the site.

Most of these fish died because a fish trap collapsed at the site just as the annual run was beginning. The fishtrap is back in operation now and Perry said it is working reasonably well.

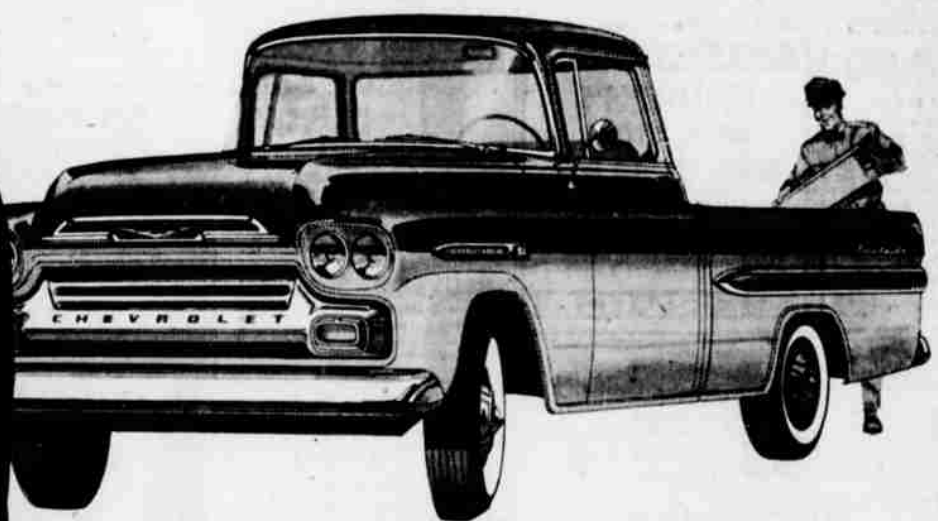
