

Hatfield Voices Stand In Speech

PORTLAND (AP) — "I have fought to bear the standard of the Republican party," Mark Hatfield, the party's gubernatorial nominee and secretary of state, said Tuesday night.

"But I am not of the school that says 'party first and the public second,'" he said. "We must bring together people of ability, capacity and experience regardless of political ability."

Hatfield spelled out his stand after Democrats claimed he was trying to play down his party affiliation for Democratic votes and Republicans contended he ought to mention it more prominently.

Hatfield also came under attack from James W. Goodsell, Oregon labor press editor, who said Hatfield attempted to buy space

in labor's own newspaper to attack labor's programs.

"Religious publications do not accept advertising from anti-religious bigots," Goodsell said. "Veterans publications do not accept advertising from enemies of veterans' welfare. Private utility publications do not publish ads promoting the high federal dam at Hells Canyon."

Goodsell said the columns of the non-profit labor newspaper were not for sale "to any candidate just because he has unlimited funds to spend."

DIES FROM FALL

Shelton Sentenced 3 Years For Rape On Plea Of Guilty

Circuit Judge Charles S. Woodrich sentenced former Roseburg sanitary engineer, Robert Darrell Shelton, to three years in the state penitentiary Tuesday for rape.

The 50-year-old Shelton entered a plea of guilty to the charge on Sept. 26 before Circuit Judge Carl E. Wimberly. He was sent to the state hospital at Salem for a pre-sentence psychiatric examination, and was returned to Roseburg late last week.

The district attorney's information charged Shelton was involved with a 15-year-old Roseburg school girl on or about March 1 of this year at his SE Stephens St. trailer home.

Shelton formerly was employed by the city's engineering department.

Put On Probation

Judge Woodrich handed down a three-year prison sentence to Robert Vernon Johnson, 18, of Sutherlin, then placed the youth on probation for the same period of time.

Terms of the probation for Johnson, who pleaded guilty to grand larceny, are that he make restitution in the sum of \$25 a week to owners of a Sutherlin supermarket until the money taken is fully repaid.

Johnson admitted taking an estimated \$1,600 from the till of the City Drive-In Market where he worked as a clerk. One reason he helped himself to the cash, he said, was to buy clothes and "other things" for his brothers and sisters. He's the oldest of eight youngsters in the family.

In another matter before the court Tuesday, Judge Woodrich ordered probation revoked for Clarence A. Stanley, 35, of Warren, Ore.

Stanley entered a plea in April of 1956 to an indictment charging him with burglary. He admitted breaking into the Red & White Store at Yoncalla on March 29 of that year, coming through a skylight.

Judge Wimberly, on April 26 two years ago, gave him a three-year prison sentence, but placed him on probation.

The state probation and parole officer, however, recently reported several violations of the terms. He said, among other things, Stanley had moved from state to state without notifying his parole officer. There also were other infractions.

Revocation of a parole means Stanley must now serve the original prison sentence imposed nearly two and a half years ago.

Metal Tape Snags Power Line; Workman Killed

McMINNVILLE (AP) — Ronald A. Boesel, 27, Portland, was killed Tuesday when the opposite end of a metal tape measure he was holding was thrown accidentally over a high voltage wire.

Bert Kleinbars and Boesel were attempting to measure the height of telephone wires east of here near Highway 99W. Kleinbars, attempting to throw the tape over the wires, threw them over a higher power line.

Kleinbars freed Boesel from the hot tape, but was unable to revive him with artificial respiration.

Sec. Seaton Would Stop Further Dam Building On Snake

WASHINGTON (AP) — Stopping further dam construction on the middle Snake River was urged Tuesday by Interior Secretary Fred Seaton, who said the area must be preserved as a fish producing area.

In a letter to Army Secretary Wilbur Brucker, Seaton said the middle Snake basin up to and including the water shed of the Imnaha River is the key remaining Columbia Basin area for production of salmon.

The Army Engineers are believed to be considering a number of dams in the area below the Imnaha. These, Seaton said, "would present grave problems for the maintenance and development of anadromous fish production in the area."

Seaton urged early adoption of studies concerning the multipurpose possibilities of sites above the mouth of the Imnaha. Preliminary investigations indicate there are storage sites of considerable potential which can be developed now, he said.

He recommended that the Army join "in deferring the planning and recommendation of any more dams" in the middle Snake below the Imnaha "until such time as competent fishery authorities agree that the problem of passing fish over high dams, both upstream and downstream, has been solved."

Seaton has urged a detailed study of the feasibility of a high dam at the Nez Perce site on the Snake, which would be below the mouth of the Salmon River.
