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DeHood-Winston Church Group To Trick Or Treat

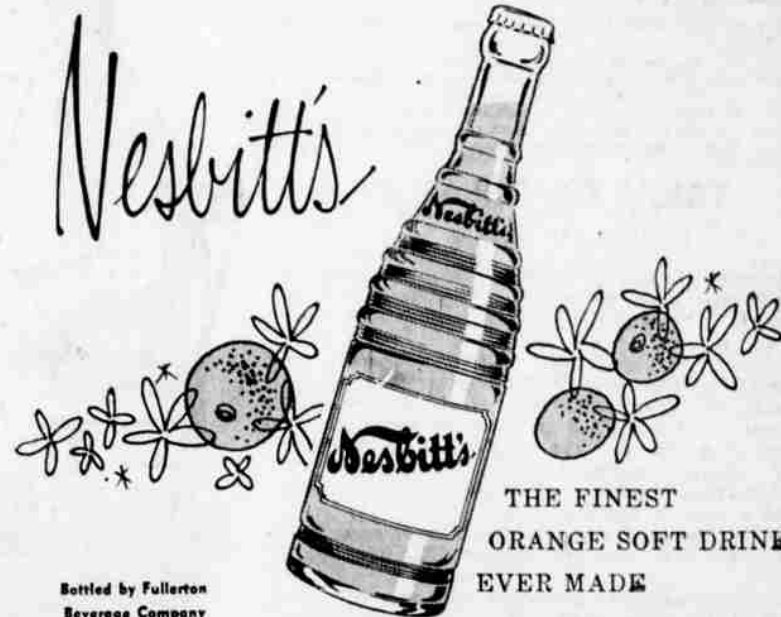

Hoxsey Clinic Will Be Closed

JOHNSTOWN, Pa. (AP)—The Hoxsey Cancer Clinic at nearby Portage will close permanently Nov. 1, administrator John J. Haluska announced Wednesday.

Haluska, a former state senator and one of the directors of the clinic, declined to elaborate.

One source said the six directors decided to call it quits to beat the expected signing of a contempt order by the U.S. District Court in Pittsburgh.

Contempt charges against the directors were made public Oct. 8 by U.S. Atty. Hubert I. Teitelbaum in Pittsburgh. He said the clinic and its officers violated an injunction they agreed to abide by last October.

The court order last year stipulated that pills used by the clinic in the treatment of cancer would not be dispensed to out-of-state patients.

The clinic was opened in March 1935. Shortly thereafter the food and drug administration seized a quarter of a million of pills which it said were misbranded. The FDA said the pills were worthless.

The clinic was named after Harry M. Hoxsey, a Texas Naturopath.
