

State Says County Elk Prospects Fair-Good

Elk, upland bird and waterfowl hunters will have a spotty success this weekend, depending on local conditions.

Here is a report of conditions for the major hunting areas in the state provided Wednesday by the Oregon Game Commission.

Northwest

Elk — Hunting is considered good in Clatsop County but individual hunters are not having good luck. Most of the animals have been taken to dense thickets and hunting is in prospect for the rest of the season.

Southwest

Elk — Prospects should be fair to good in Douglas County for the rest of the season. Fair to good in the forecast in Coos and Curry counties. Best hunting will be in heavy cover and timber areas.

Waterfowl

Conditions are fair to good. Continued rain will improve the situation. Hunting is

Central

Waterfowl — Gunning is fair to good in the Klamath area. About 2½ million ducks and 100,000 geese are in the lower Klamath.

Upland birds

Populations are abundant in the Columbia area and down through Central Oregon.

East

Waterfowl — Hunting is slow in Coquille Valley and Coos Bay areas, but poor in Jackson and Josephine counties until migrants arrive.

Upland birds

Pheasant cocks have come out of the brush and are seen regularly in the lower areas. There is an ample supply of valley quail.

Stiff Cold Winds Send Temperatures Tumbling

Freezing weather nipped much of the West and Midwest today. Temperatures dipped into the 20s in Casper, Wyo., Bismarck, N.D., Omaha, Neb., Helena, Mont., Des Moines, Iowa, and Duluth, Minn., and into the low 30s in Denver, Minneapolis-St. Paul, Chicago, Milwaukee, and South Bend, Ind.

The lowest reported was one below zero in Big Piney, Wyo. Wind gusts of 45 to 65 m.p.h. churned waters in most of the Great Lakes during the night. Brisk winds carried the cold air into the East.

The cool air was expected to move into the Atlantic states during the day after Wednesday's comparatively mild weather. But winds were expected to diminish sharply in the Northeast as the storm center north of the Great Lakes moves farther into Canada.

It was cool in most other parts of the country except in the Eastern sections ahead of the advancing cold front and in parts of the Pacific Coast.

40 HUNGARIANS SENTENCED
BUDAPEST (AP) — The Budapest Municipal Court has sentenced 40 Hungarians to jail for cheating the Communist government on repairing damage from the 1956 revolt. The sentences are subject to appeal.

The judge said the defendants billed the government for fictitious repairs to undamaged houses and sometimes collected twice for work they did. Their total take was put at the equivalent of about \$100,000.

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
