Recent visitors of Mr. and Mrs. Pat Melton were Mrs. Melton's parents, Mr. and Mrs. Raymond Ford of Eugene.

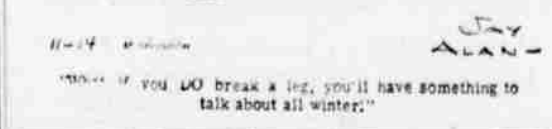
