

Neuberger Says Holmes Must Name Republican

PORTLAND (AP) — Oregon's next secretary of state will have to be a Republican unless the state law governing appointments to elective offices is unconstitutional, U.S. Sen. Richard L. Neuberger said.

Neuberger, who wrote the law as a state senator in 1953, said Wednesday this precludes a move by Gov. Robert Holmes to appoint a Democrat to the post.

Holmes said he asked his legal advisors to see if such a move were possible when Hatfield re-

signed as secretary of state to become governor Jan. 12, replacing Holmes.

"It seemed logical to me that the will of the voters would best be carried out if their wishes at the ballot box were respected by making the appointment of the

same political party as that of the person originally elected," Neuberger, a Democrat, said.

"However, if the courts should declare my bill unconstitutional, of course, that would add an additional factor which might change things."

Search Goes On For Three Scouts

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) — "They've got to find them today. I don't know what I'm going to do if they don't find them today. He's up there."

"I know he's up there... They've got to find him... They've just got to..." Mrs. Bruce La Noue, mother of one of three Tucson Boy Scouts missing since Saturday in the snowbound Santa Rita Mountains, sobbed softly. Her son, Michael, 13, disappeared while hiking with Mike Early, 16, and David Greenberg, 12.

Parents of the three boys were contacted Wednesday by searchers who wanted to borrow clothing worn by the boys. The clothes were to be used by bloodhounds to pick up the boys' trail. The youngsters were last seen trying to climb 9,400-foot Mt. Baldy in a driving snowstorm.

Meanwhile, the searchers got ready for their biggest effort today. About 350 men—265 soldiers, 35 airmen and about 50 deputies and volunteers—prepared to tackle the mountain from two sides. Private planes and Army helicopters continued to scan the bleak, frigid mountain range.

Next Draft Call Size Cut To Begin Big Reduction

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Defense Department today called the size of its next draft call. At the same time it ordered the armed services to begin a reduction of over 70,000 from present manpower strength.

The draft quota asked for January is 9,000 men. This is 2,000 below calls for the last several months and the lowest since December 1957 when 11,000 men were drafted. All draftees will be for the Army.

Simultaneously, the Pentagon announced that Secretary of Defense McElroy has ordered the Army, Marine Corps, Navy and Air Force "to begin action" to trim the total armed services manpower from a present 2,596,282 to 2,325,000 by next June.

McElroy's orders to the service secretaries said that "if it is feasible" to make the cut before next June, that may be done. The services are to report to him by Dec. 1 on what reduction steps have been taken.

Pentagon spokesmen said the cut in the January draft quota did not mean the department was working toward abandonment of selective service. On the contrary, they said, McElroy recently emphasized the continued need for the draft.

The draft law will expire June 30, 1960, if it is re-enacted. The Pentagon said the quota cut was possible because Army enlistments and grade enlistment rates have increased. It said the cutback in over-all strength also will influence the Army manpower draft requirements.

Caril's Trial Goes To Jury

LINCOLN, Neb. (AP) — The murder case of Caril Ann Fugate, 15-year-old ex-sweetheart of killer Charles Starkweather, went to a jury at 10 a.m. (CST) today.

The jury's task: to decide whether Caril shares the guilt which already has brought Starkweather a death penalty.

The girl is charged on two counts—one with first degree murder in the death of Bennet, Neb., schoolboy Robert Jensen and second with murder in the perpetration of a robbery of Jensen.

Judge Harry Spencer told jurors they may find Caril guilty of either first or second degree murder or innocent on count one.

On count two the verdict must be either guilty of first degree or innocent.

Second degree murder carries a penalty of 10 years to life imprisonment.

First degree murder is punishable in Nebraska by life imprisonment or death in the electric chair. The jury specifies which penalty shall apply.

Judge Spencer told jurors that aiding or abetting would make Caril equally guilty with Starkweather under the law.

He advised jurors to use "great care and caution" in weighing the testimony of Starkweather, a principal state witness against his former sweetheart.

Pace Of Dave Beck Trial Slowed By Small Items Study

TACOMA (AP) — The pace of the Dave Beck income tax trial slowed Wednesday as testimony revolved around payments made for minor repairs and improvements at Beck's home, a tavern and a beer distributing agency.

The jobs totaled about \$10,000. This was paid to John Lindsay, Seattle contractor, during the 1959-60 period in which Beck is accused of cheating the government out of \$240,000 in income taxes. Lindsay, in turn, paid other companies doing part of the work.

Lindsay built Beck's sumptuous waterfront home and others in the ex-Teamsters Union president's "compound." The Senate racketeering investigating committee has said the \$136,416 given the contractor for this work came from union funds in Seattle.

John S. Obenour, assistant U.S. attorney, presented a bank account ledger sheet showing that the Teamsters' Joint Council 28 Building Assn. of Seattle drew a check for \$1,368.59 to pay for some of the repairs.

Beck owns the tavern building and his relatives and friends operate the beer distributing company where other work was done.

The trial, in the middle of its second week, continues to focus on the amount of Beck's personal expenses in 1959-60, and how much were defrayed by others, presumably with Teamster funds.

Raging Fire Sweeps Town In Washington

COLFAX, Wash. (AP) — A raging fire swept through the biggest business building in town during the night, wiped out two stores and four medical offices with a loss estimated Wednesday as high as \$600,000.

with minor injuries in what was perhaps the worst fire in the history of this Whitman County community of some 3,200 persons. The front of the two-story, 50-year-old Henry Building collapsed into the street at 12:15 a.m. to complete the destruction about three hours after the fire started.

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Network, Union Recess Talks

NEW YORK (AP) — Negotiators for four major television and radio networks and a performers' union recessed contract talks today.

The union, the American Federation of Television and Radio Artists, reported substantial progress had been achieved and agreed to extend its strike deadline through another session later today.

Any one of four issues still unresolved, a union spokesman said, could cause a strike.

The union had set strike deadlines for midnight last Saturday and for midnight Tuesday but extended both for further negotiations.

The four unresolved issues according to the spokesman are: Stockpiling of video tapes for use during strikes; pay to performers for use of taped network shows on non-network stations; use of tapes made by staff announcers after they are off duty; size of payments to performers for taped programs.

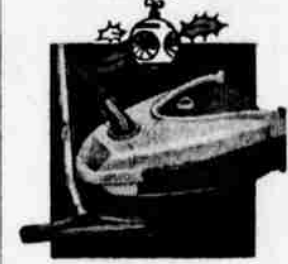
No network representative would comment on negotiations. The union also seeks a 10 per cent wage increase across the board and demanded additional pay for performers each time a tape presentation is re-run on the networks. Current wages have not been made public.

Department Commander Ralph Baldwin and Chief of Staff Therman Green will be present with other officers for the dedication of barracks' colors.

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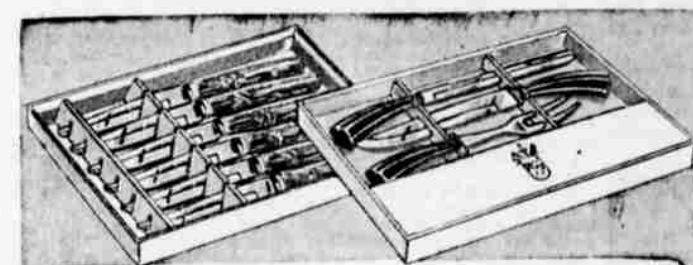
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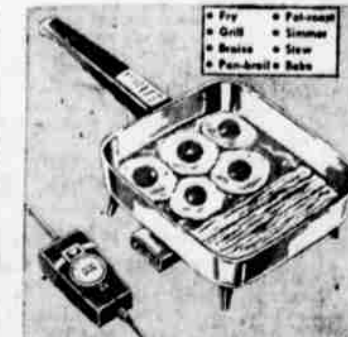
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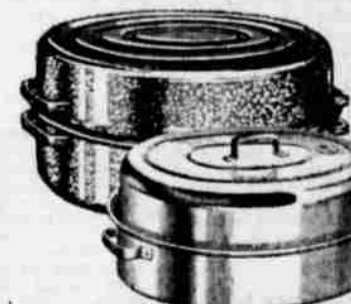
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
