

Oregon Visits OSC For Non-Loop Clash

CORVALLIS, Ore. (AP) — Oregon State, a power last year in the Pacific Coast Conference, tonight will meet Oregon in the first basketball game of the season for both teams.

Oregon State last season ended with a 12-4 conference record, good enough for a co-championship with California. Oregon, far out of the running, ended in seventh at 6-10.

Things may be a little different this year for Oregon State.

The Beavers were paced to a 20-6 season record last year by 6-7 Dave Gambee, the squad's leading scorer. He was lost by graduation.

Duck Losses Heavy

Oregon also lost heavily at graduation. Gone are Charlie Franklin and Hal Duffy, the squad's top scorers.

Oregon State coach Slats Gill said the Beavers this season will rely heavily on a sophomore, 6-6 Karl Anderson.

With him on the first team, tonight will be 6-8 Gary Gobie, 6-2 Ted Miller and two speedy backcourt men, Lee Harman and Jimmy Anderson.

Oregon Coach Steve Belko said he also will have some tall men in the starting lineup — though none are as big as OSC's Anderson and Gobie.

Dale Herron, Denny Strickland and Stu Robertson all are 6-5, and all will open tonight's game for the Ducks.

Slick Guards Set

Oregon's slickest ball-handlers, Bud Kuykendall and Chuck Rask, will line up at the guard positions.

A newcomer to the Oregon varsity, which had a season record of 13-11 last year, will be Butch Kimpton of Klamath Falls. Belko said that Kimpton, a member of the Fresh last season, probably will alternate with either Rask or Kuykendall.

Tonight's contest will be a non-conference game.

Oregon will swing back into action Friday and Saturday at Eugene against Brigham Young. Oregon State will travel to play Utah those nights.

Oregon will open its conference season against Southern California Jan. 2 at Eugene. OSC's PCC opener will be against Southern California Jan. 3 at Corvallis.

College Squads Prep For Bowls

Bowl-bound college football teams began pointing toward post-season games today. But one couldn't blame Louisiana State, California and Syracuse for showing more determination than the others.

LSU, the nation's only major undefeated and untied team, will make its fifth appearance in the Sugar Bowl. The Bayou Tigers have yet to win a bowl game. This will be their sixth bowl trip, fifth to the New Orleans classic. Clemson, LSU's opponent, will be playing in the Sugar Bowl for the first time, but has a 3-2 record in other bowl competition.

Bears Seek Improvement

California is 2-4-1 in the Rose Bowl. Iowa, the Bears' New Year's Day foe, has a 35-19 victory over Oregon State in 1957 to show for its only outing in Pasadena.

Syracuse, which meets Oklahoma in the Orange Bowl, has had only one previous experience in that game. It emerged with a 61-6 pasting by Alabama in 1953. Oklahoma has won its last three in the Miami Jan. 1 game after losing to Tennessee in 1959.

Clemson was one of five teams to help fill the major bowls as a result of Saturday's action. The others were the Air Force Academy, Mississippi and Florida.

So this is the way the major bowl picture shapes up: Rose Bowl at Pasadena, Calif.—Iowa (7-1) vs. California (7-3). Sugar Bowl at New Orleans—Louisiana State (10-0) vs. Clemson (8-2). Orange Bowl at Miami—Oklahoma (9-1) vs. Syracuse (8-1). Cotton Bowl at Dallas—Texas Christian (8-2) vs. Air Force Academy (9-0). Gator Bowl at Jacksonville, Fla.—Florida (6-3-1) vs. Mississippi (8-2).

H-S Plays Cowboys

Among the minor bowls, Hardin Simmons (6-4), who the Bogler Conference title Friday and was named to oppose Wyoming (7-3), the Skyline champ, in the Sun Bowl. The Blue Grass Bowl is expected to name its teams today.

Clemson earned a shot at Louisiana State by defeating Furman 36-19 Saturday. The Air Force Academy accepted a Cotton Bowl bid after whipping Colorado 20-14. Mississippi blanked Mississippi State 21-0. Florida edged Miami 12-9.

Army, which froons on post-season competition, put away its first unbeaten season since 1949 by licking Navy 22-6. The Cadets, with only an Oct. 25 tie with Pittsburgh to mar their record, finished strong against the Middles. Bob Anderson scored twice for Army.

Auburn, second to LSU in the current Associated Press rankings but banned from bowl play, nipped Alabama 14-6. Southern Methodist beat Texas Christian 20-13; Oklahoma defeated Oklahoma State 7-0; and Notre Dame came from behind to beat Southern California 20-13.

Only two games remain on the regular season schedule. Boston College meets Holy Cross and Oregon engages Miami this Saturday.

Big Crowd Sees Pederson Win

One of the largest crowds in the past three years attended the wrestling matches in the Community Building at the fairgrounds in Roseburg Saturday night.

The fans saw Eric "The Great" Pederson defeat Luther Lindsey in the main event and Little Beaver and Tiny Tim win over Irish Jackie and Fuzzy Cupid in the midjet team match.

The opener was won by Karl von Himmler over Tony Ferrara.

Officials Mull Whether To Stage Blue Grass Tilt

LOUISVILLE, Ky. (AP) — Blue Grass Bowl officials are expected to decide tonight whether there will be a game this year—and if so, who will play.

There was no announcement during the weekend about the first bowl game which is scheduled here Dec. 13.

A dozen football teams have been under consideration. The last rumored foes were Alabama and Vanderbilt.

WSC Ruled Out Of Spectators' Role At SF Tilt

SPOKANE (AP)—The Washington State Cougars who lost the chance to negotiate to play in a post-season football game because of a Pacific Coast Conference rule won't be able to even watch one because of another PCC rule.

The WSC Alumni Assn. had planned to send the entire team to San Francisco to see the East-West game. But association President Robert Neilson of Spokane said Saturday the trip was called off at the request of WSC Athletic Director Stan Bates.

Bates told us that furnishing transportation, rooms and tickets for the team could be in violation of the Pacific Coast Conference's aid-to-athletes policy, although he appreciated our desire to do something for the team, Neilson said.

The group had originally planned to sponsor the Cougars as spectators at the Rose Bowl but switched to the East-West when WSC players Bob Newman and Bill Steiger were selected to appear in the benefit contest.

Under the PCC agreement, UCLA and USC earlier had vetoed WSC's request for permission to seek a bowl bid.

Loop Strips OTI Of Championship

PORTLAND (AP)—Four schools branded by Oregon Tech this fall have voted to strip OTI of its Oregon Collegiate Conference football title.

The action was taken at a Saturday meeting of the coaches and athletic directors of the conference.

Some sports reporters here commented that Oregon Tech got off lucky. There had been speculation earlier that OTI might be put on probation.

Presidents of the conference schools now will vote on the recommendations of the coaches. It was expected they would follow the Saturday vote.

OTI compiled a perfect 4-0 record in the conference. But the coaches voted to strip OTI of the title, and gave it to second-place Oregon College of Education.

The action was taken because four OTI players were ruled ineligible to compete. The coaches also voted to take one year of eligibility from each of those players.

After the meeting, Jack Brookins, dean of instruction at Oregon Tech, said the vote was "very fair."

Brookins added: "We were given a good hearing. All details were discussed thoroughly. We are happy to be in the conference."

None of those details, though, were released. The coaches refused to disclose the names of the players, or to tell why they were ruled ineligible.

Roseburg, 3 Others In Hoop Tourney

CORVALLIS (AP)—North Salem, Beaverton, Marshfield and Roseburg were invited Saturday to participate in a newly added high school division of Oregon State College's annual Far West basketball classic here.

The high school teams will play in the afternoon and the college teams at night, athletic director Roy Kiene said.

The first round Saturday Dec. 27 will put Roseburg against Beaverton and North Salem against Marshfield. The finals will be Monday Dec. 29.

In the college division, Oregon State will meet the Air Force Academy and Wyoming will play Iowa in the first round. The finals will be Monday night.

Van Pelt Leads Winnipeg To Grey Cup Victory

VANCOUVER (AP)—Jimmy Van Pelt, the 25-year-old rookie quarterback of the Winnipeg Blue Bombers, was still hailed today after spectacularly leading his team to the Grey Cup football championship.

The former University of Michigan star passed, ran and kicked the bombers to a stunning 35-28 win over the defending champion Hamilton Tiger-Cats in the Saturday playoff for Canada's pro title.

Van Pelt scored two touchdowns, kicked a pair of field goals and four conversions for 22 points, best individual effort in Grey Cup history.
