

# Russian, Japanese Fishing In Bering Sea Area Under U.S. Senate Investigation

SEATTLE (AP)—Dispatch of a Navy had informed his Washington office Russian aircraft are flying patrols over the Soviet fishing fleet.

The air patrols are increasing, Magnuson said, and Sen. Henry M. Jackson (D-Wash.) added: "We have reason to believe the Russians are fishing for more than fish."

The announcement highlighted a day of testimony in which witness after witness demanded passage of legislation aimed at protecting the Bristol Bay, Alaska, salmon.

The remarks came as Magnuson told witnesses and congressmen attending the hearing that the

tion of salmon from any country not following conservation methods practiced by the United States. Such legislation would strike a telling blow to the huge Japanese salmon market in this country. Japanese fishing fleets have been held responsible for the decimation of Alaska's valuable salmon resources.

Donald McKernan, head of the commercial fisheries division of the Interior Department, told the committee he could not comment on the present status of the bill, which has been sent to the Interior Department.

George Johansen of Seattle, secretary-treasurer of the Alaska Fishermen's Union, suggested countering the new Russian threat by subsidizing a fleet of U.S. vessels to fish off the Russian coast.

Magnuson said he believed the Russians would board any American ships fishing off the coast of Kamchatka.

Many witnesses, including Alaska Gov. William A. Egan, said they had decided reluctantly that the only way to persuade the Japanese to cooperate in salmon conservation is to pass the import ban.

## Skate Coming Home

GROTON, Conn. (AP)—The nuclear submarine Skate, which recently made a second trip to the North Pole, will arrive here April 7, the submarine base reported.

The submarine remained under arctic winter ice for 12 days, logged 3,000 miles and surfaced 10 times, once right at the North Pole.

## Church Council Head Suggests Catholic Link

NEW YORK (AP)—An American Protestant leader has suggested that the Roman Catholic Church join the World Council of Churches as a move toward advancing the cause of Christian unity.

The Rev. Dr. Eugene Carson Blake, chief administrative officer of the United Presbyterian Church, Friday told an annual meeting of the Associated Church Press: "The Council is open to the Roman Catholic Church if it wishes to join the ecumenical movement."

Ecumenical—meaning universal or worldwide—is the term churches use to denote Christian unity efforts.

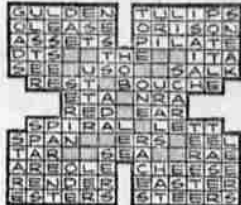

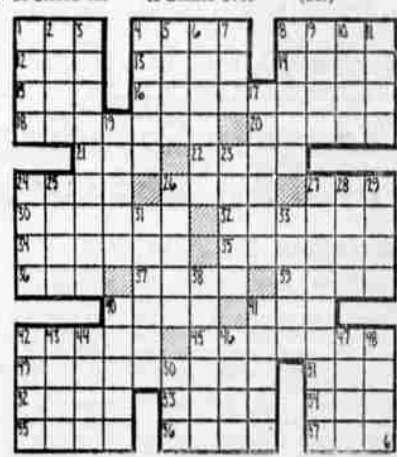
