Iraq Trouble May Become Like Korea

A Communist attempt to seize control of Iraq by naked force has become a distinct possibility. If that happens, something in the nature of another Korea also is possible.

The threat of a Communist coup in Baghdad becomes more real with persistent reports of an infiltration of armed Kurds from the Soviet Union, plus an Iraqi decision to arm civilian units known as the "People's Resistance."

Because Iraq has no borders with any Communist-ruled country, a forcible Red seizure of its government would be a departure from past practice. Up to now, armed communism has not leaped over land barriers. But the elements for such a leap are present. Also present are the makings of a situation not unlike that in Korea nine years ago.

Ready in Syria

Troops of Gamal Abdel Nasser's Arab Republic, according to Turkish reports, already have taken up positions in northern Syria near the Iraqi border. A quarter of the tribesmen who supported the recent pro-Nasser revolt in north

National Forest Timber For Sale

Bulldog Creek Sale

Oral auction bids will be received by the regional forester, or his authorized representative at the office of the forest supervisor, Post Office Building, Roseburg, Oregon, beginning at 2:00 p.m., May 14, 1959, for all merchantable timber marked or designated for cutting on an area embracing 322 acres, more or less, within sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 9, and 10, T. 25 S., R. 2 E., W.M., surveyed in the Steamboat Creek Area, Umpqua National Forest, Oregon. The estimated volume is 15,400 M board feet of Douglas-fir and western white pine, 1,500 M board feet of sugar pine, and 2,100 M board feet of western hemlock and other species. The minimum acceptable bid per M board feet is as follows: Douglas-fir and western white pine, \$18.85; sugar pine \$18.15; western hemlock and other species \$5.30. This includes the following base rates, per M board feet, for stumpage: \$6.20 plus an additional \$1.15 for stumpage for the first period for Douglas-fir and western white pine, \$11.15 plus an additional \$3.90 for stumpage for the first period for sugar pine, and \$1.00 plus an additional \$3.20 for stumpage for the first period for western hemlock and other species, plus 39.65 for sale area betterment and 80.45 for slash disposal for all species. The Forest Service shall as of and effective on May 1, 1961 redetermine the stumpage rates and the required deposits for the ensuing period. In no event, however, shall rates for stumpage and sale area betterment be established which are less than the sum of the base rates and required deposits for sale area betterment as stated above, and in no event shall redetermined rates which are lower than those bid become effective for a particular species until at least the following volume of that species has been sealed and paid for: Douglas-fir and western white pine, 10,200 M board feet; sugar pine, 1,000 M board feet; and western hemlock and other species, 1,400 M board feet. Sealed bids will be publicly opened and posted at the office of the forest supervisor at 2:00 p.m. All those who submitted a satisfactory sealed bid will be permitted immediately to continue auction bidding. A money order, bank draft, cashier's or certified check in the sum of \$14,000.00 must accompany each bid, to be applied on the purchase price of the timber. All bids must be accompanied by a check in the sum of \$14,000.00, to be applied on the purchase price of the timber. If requested by the purchaser, contract terms will permit felling of timber in advance of payment up to the value of the performance bond. If an oral bid is declared to be high at the closing of the auction, the bidder must immediately confirm the oral bid by submitting it in writing on a Forest Service bid form. The right to reject any and all bids is reserved. Forest Service bid forms for use in submitting sealed bids and full information concerning the timber, the conditions of sale and the submission of bids should be obtained from the district ranger, Steamboat Ranger Station, the forest supervisor, Roseburg, Oregon, or the Regional Forester, Portland, Oregon, before bids are submitted.
