Cancer Society Grant
Given Dental School

FRANKFORT, Ind. (AP)—Alice H. Norris, 92, former national president of the World War I Mothers, died Friday in a nursing home.

PITTSBURGH, Pa. (AP)—Dr. Ray Osgood Hughes, prominent author of elementary and high school textbooks on social studies and citizenship, died Friday. He was 79.

PORTLAND (AP)—Grants totaling more than \$13,000 have been made to the state dental school by the American Cancer Society.

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
