Seattle Cleric Named Aide To Anglican Church Leader

NEW YORK (AP)—The Rev. Stephen F. Bayne Jr., of Seattle, Wash., will take over next Jan. 1 a new post that will make him the second most influential figure in the worldwide Anglican communion.

Bishop Bayne, who has headed the Olympia Diocese of Western Washington will become executive officer of the global family of 40 million Christians. His appointment is a move to strengthen church ties across national borders.

Appointment of Bishop Bayne was announced Sunday. He was chosen for the post by the Most Rev. Geoffrey Francis Fisher, archbishop of Canterbury, primate of the Church of England.

Bishop Bayne, who will be out-ranked only by the archbishop, is the first American named as an international prelate in Anglicanism. The new position was created last summer by the Lambeth Conference, a gathering of Anglican bishops from throughout the world held every 10 years.

Bishop Bayne, 50, will have his headquarters in London. He will administer two key agencies of world Anglicanism—the Advisory Council of Missionary Strategy, which serves as the central planning group for missionary work, and the Consultative Body of the Lambeth Conference, which serves as an interim executive body between Lambeth conferences.

Anglican churches, like the

Episcopal Church in the United States, are wholly independent, self-governing bodies.

They all sprang from the Church of England. They look to it as the senior see. They are akin in worship, doctrine and ecclesiastical organization.

Bishop Bayne will continue to serve the United States Episcopal Church as bishop in charge of its 11 American congregations in Europe.

OAKLANDERS SING

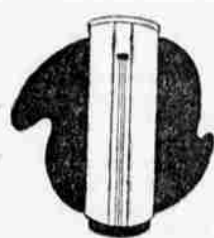
