

Myrtle Creek Downs Irish Twice

Viks Take Over Edge In Umpqua Standings

Sturdy pitching, timely hitting and 19 miscues by the opponent.

These were the factors in the double win scored by the Myrtle Creek Vikings over the Riddle Irish Tuesday afternoon.

By winning 7-4 and 5-2, the Viks moved the Irish out of the top spot in the Umpqua Valley League standings, and took over the league leadership.

Frosty Loghry's forces were led to their wins by the mound performances of Fred Earwood and Wes Davidson and the hitting of their No. 3 man, Gregg Lindquist.

Earwood threw a four-hitter in the first game of the twin-bill and gave up one earned run. Davidson set the Irish down on a two-hitter in the nightcap and also was tagged for just one earned run.

Lindquist ended the afternoon five hits in seven trips and collected one RBI. He also scored three runs. He hit three singles, a double and a home run.

First Loss In Five

Gene Morrison was tagged with his first loss in five starts in the first game. But, in all fairness to the Irish right-hander, he worked the game with a badly bruised thumb on his right hand. This was an injury sustained last Saturday in a non-counting contest.

He gave the thumb the ice treatment at the end of each inning.

Also on the Irish side of the ledger was the hitting of Morrison's battery mate in the second game, Catcher Dave Weakley, collected the two hits off Davidson—a single in the third and a home run in the sixth.

Three round-trippers were hit in the doubleheader. In addition to Weakley's blast, Leland Paetz sent a circuit blow to left center in the third frame of the first game.

Two other shots sent the hitter around the bases but one was on an error and, on the other, a relay throw to the plate cut the runner down short of a homer.

In the second game, Bob Paine connected on a Steve Keele pitch in the third and sent it to right.

Rightfielder Mike Patrick misjudged the ball and it hit his glove and rolled. Paine skirted the bases driving Dick Lowell across ahead of him.

It was an important hit at the time as the two runs gave the Viks a 2-1 lead.

In the sixth frame, Lowell belted one to right, but this time Patrick recovered the ball in time to fire to first baseman Gary Slay who in turn threw a strike to Weakley at the plate.

Out at Home

Lowell was credited with a triple and an RBI, with Brent Winston scoring the seventh run for the Viks. Lowell was out sliding in.

In both games, the Irish took the first lead, holding a 3-0 advantage in the second chapter of the opener. They led 1-0 in the third inning of the nightcap. Each time, the Viks overtook them and moved into the lead.

Missing from the Viking lineup was second baseman Bob Cavanaugh. The hustling Vik took it upon himself to practice sliding late Monday.

Unfortunately, he injured his back and was in no condition for baseball Tuesday.

Doug Thompson, a fine second-

sacker also, was at that position against the Irish Tuesday.

He handled seven chances with just one boot. Twice he made the tough play as he ran to his right to field a ball behind the second-base sack and make the long throw.

As Dizzy Dean would say, "... he come to play!"
