

Portland Bakers Union Joins Teamsters Union

PORTLAND (AP) — Plans to leave its parent independent union and enter the new AFL-CIO Bakers Union were announced here Wednesday by the Portland Candy, Cracker and Cookie Workers local.

The 900-member local has been affiliated with the Baker and Confectionery Workers Union, which was ousted two years ago by the AFL-CIO on corruption charges.

A smaller Portland local remains affiliated with the independent union.

Roseburg Rector At Gearhart Session

The Rev. Alfred S. Tyson, rector of St. George's Episcopal Church in Roseburg, is attending a training session in mental health therapy this week at Gearhart.

Fifty ministers of all denominations are attending from all parts of Oregon, on invitation from the Oregon Council of Churches, which is sponsoring the conference along with the National Institute of Mental Health, the public Health Department of Oregon and the Oregon Mental Health Assn.

One of the leaders is chaplain Ernest E. Bruder, Episcopal coordinator of chaplain services for St. Elizabeth's Hospital, Washington, D.C. A number of nationally known psychiatrists and psychologists are on the faculty. It is financed by the National Institute of Mental Health through a budget of over \$5,000. Father Tyson will be back for Sunday's services.

Cash For Green Peter Start Asked By Neuberger, Porter

WASHINGTON (AP) — Sen. Richard L. Neuberger (D-Ore.) and Rep. Charles O. Porter (D-Ore.) Wednesday asked a House Appropriations subcommittee for 2½ million dollars to start construction of Green Peter Dam on the Santiam River in their state.

Neuberger said the project must be started immediately to prevent recurrence of flood damage.

The Eisenhower administration has budgeted no construction money for the project.

The request for funds for Green Peter was included in the \$9,465,019 asked by Neuberger and the \$30,000,000 sought by Porter for navigation, power and reclamation projects in Oregon and in the state's 4th congressional district.

Norman Price Jr., assistant secretary of the Suislaw Port Commission and Tom Chamberlin, Newport port manager, asked \$100,000 for planning for the Yaquina Bay harbor project.

Other major amounts sought by Neuberger and Porter above those asked by the administration in parentheses:

Hills Creek Included

Hills Creek Dam, \$9,800,000 (\$8,300,000); Rogue River Harbor, Gold Beach, \$2,000,000 (\$1,500,000); Willamette River bank protection, come River navigation, preconstruction planning \$23,000 (none).

The senator asked \$24,000 and Porter sought \$40,000 to begin investigation of the Illinois Valley Division of the Rogue River Reclamation Project, particularly the Sucker Creek Project.

Other Neuberger requests would increase appropriations above budgeted amounts for John Day Dam by \$5,000,000 to \$25,000,000; provide an extra \$700,000 for Lower Columbia fish research, and make available \$600,000 for bank protection in the Warrenton-Hammond area.

The drive for funds to start construction of Green Peter and Lower Monumental dams was joined by major Pacific Northwest power firms and agencies.

Eugene Man Speaks

Supt. Byron Price of the Eugene Water and Electric Board, acting as spokesman for the Pacific Northwest Utilities Conference Committee, urged 2½ million for each of these projects.

The conference is made up of 25 public and private utilities in Oregon, Washington and Idaho.

The conference also sought \$9,800,000 for Hills Creek Reservoir. That is 1½ million more than asked by the administration.

Price also urged allocation of funds, not asked by the administration, for advance engineering and design work on three projects: Little Goose Dam, \$450,000; Lower Granite Dam, \$500,000; both on the Lower Snake River; and \$387,000 for Libby Reservoir on the Kootenai River in Montana.

Umpqua Forest Tracts Bought

In a pair of separate salvage sales conducted at the Bohemia Ranger Station, the Umpqua National Forest this week sold a total of 720,000 board feet of timber for a total price of \$33,970.

Both tracts were in the Bohemia Ranger District about 26 miles southeast of Cottage Grove. An estimated 620,000 board feet of Douglas fir was involved in the sales.

The largest sale involved 470,000 board feet sold to Michael P. Vander Kley, Cottage Grove, for a total bid of \$24,754.50. Total appraisal of the timber, located on 405 acres, was \$14,774.50.

The sale included 400,000 board feet of Douglas fir appraised at \$34.60 per thousand board feet and 70,000 board feet of western hemlock and other species appraised at \$13.35 per thousand. Vander Kley bid \$59.55 on the Douglas fir and the appraisal price for the rest.

Other bidders included Freeman Higginbotham, Eugene; Di Paolo Logging Co., Eugene; M & L Logging, Eugene, and R. M. Jorgensen, Springfield.

A total of 250,000 board feet of timber appraised at \$7,886.50 went to Di Paolo Logging Co. for a total bid of \$9,215.50 in the other sale.

The timber, located on 150 acres, included 220,000 board feet of Douglas fir appraised at \$33.20 and 30,000 feet of western hemlock and other species appraised at \$12.75. Di Paolo bid \$40.15 on the Douglas fir and the appraisal price for the balance of the timber.

R. M. Jorgensen, M&L Logging and Vander Kley also bid on the timber.

GUNFIRE EXCHANGED
