

British Improving Economy, Drag Feet In U.S. Barter

LONDON (AP) — American hopes of widening the market for its consumer goods seem likely today to be deferred again. The strength of the pound sterling and the swelling of British gold reserves well above the danger point give U.S. manufacturers cause to hope.

But top officials at both the British Treasury and the Board of Trade say the time isn't ripe yet. Their view: Confidence in the pound had been restored, but until reserves are built even higher caution will be the British rule. The British government holds that the balance of trade with the United States under existing curbs on many consumer goods is still too precarious to risk further liberalization now. But they insist that their next goal now is currency convertibility is being achieved. And, of course, they add that the day would be hastened if the United States would buy still more British goods.

ICBM Launching Pads Under Way

SPOKANE (AP) — Excavation work has started here for the first of nine International Ballistic Missile launching sites in the Spokane area around Fairchild Air Force Base.

About 30 men and equipment will be moved in to excavate some 25-600 cubic yards of earth from the first site at Deer Park in Spokane County. Required depths range from 60 feet and the work will take two months.

The Army Engineers said excavation will start Wednesday on sites near Reardan and Davenport.

The 33-million-dollar installation will utilize underground launching sites for the Atlas missile which has a range of more than 5,000 miles.

Girl Drowns In Truck

TULELAKE, Calif. (AP) — A pickup truck plunged into an irrigation canal Monday and killed Kay Porterfield, 14, a high school freshman here.

Police said the girl was alone in the truck when it plunged into the canal near her family's ranch. A physician later said that drowning was the cause of death.
