

## More Consumer Items Demand Of Red Public

MOSCOW (AP) — Quiet but persistent public pressure for more consumer goods has shown itself in recent weeks. The Soviet government is seeking to meet it to some extent.

Premier Nikita Khrushchev made clear last week that his government will continue pushing ahead with its industrialization scheme, thus limiting the supply of consumer items. But some improvement is promised.

Some declaration on the subject may be expected at the meeting beginning Oct. 27 of the Supreme Soviet, the Soviet parliament. Khrushchev set the tone when he publicly discussed consumer goods on his recent tour of Siberia.

He ordered a better supply of consumer goods to Vladivostok, the port on the Pacific which is icebound for three months a year.

In a speech he told his people to dress better and get away from drab grays. He said the Soviet Union must produce more consumer goods of better quality and lower price.

What perhaps is as important as the speeches is the appearance of

letters and discussions about prices in the newspapers.

Such subjects are still handled gingerly. But the Moscow paper Soviet Russia printed a letter from a worker complaining: "I am fed up with this covering up with Spunkies and liners."

"Come down to the level of the most ordinary shoes. I have only one pair of shoes which have already lasted four years."

"Why? Because they come from the West and have a brand from abroad."

"I am not personally in need of a T-114 airliner. I manage with the help of the tram. But I want to lead a good life, to be well clad."

A member of the paper's staff investigated. He reported the writer's fellow workers were angry at what he had written, but the reporter went on to quote other workers as saying they, too, would like more things.

"Now the time has come," the reporter commented, "for us to ask all those who are engaged in making suits, furniture and television sets to give us more of them and make them better."

The Soviets were advised to learn from America how to produce goods and raise more on the farms.

"That is not idle curiosity," the article said, "Why not adopt that which is good and valuable, that which has been created by the hands of the talented American people?"

A week ago Moscow streets were filled with people rushing to the stores to begin buying goods on the installment plan, which had just been made legal.

One Moscow store advertises shoes for 233 rubles. The basic wage of factory workmen is about 800 rubles a month, so one pair of shoes would take a third of a worker's monthly pay.

Soviet production has not begun to match foreign production of consumer goods, either in quality or quantity. An increasing number of people are becoming aware of it.

### Veck Cash Said Ready

CHICAGO (AP) — The Chicago Tribune said a syndicate headed by Bill Veck will offer to buy Chuck Comiskey's 48 per cent of the Chicago White Sox today.

Comiskey reportedly met Monday with Arthur C. Allyn Jr., son of a Veck syndicate member, and requested that any such offer be put in writing. The Tribune said Allyn, also in the syndicate, agreed.

## Court Upholds Hoffa Guides

WASHINGTON (AP) — James R. Hoffa, Teamsters Union president, failed today in his effort to get free from court-appointed monitors by appealing to the Supreme Court.

The high court refused to review lower court orders which bar the Teamsters Union from holding a convention, and keep in authority a three-man board of monitors, appointed by U.S. Judge F. Dickinson Letts in January 1958, to clean up the union.

The monitors were appointed under a consent decree which settled a suit by a rank-and-file group of union members who had sought to bar Hoffa from taking office as president. The suit contended his election was rigged.

In the appeal to the Supreme Court, the Teamsters Union contended the consent decree provided for a convention any time after one year. The monitors said obstructive tactics by Hoffa prevented them from preparing the union for a clean convention and election. Letts held conditions justified delaying the convention and he was upheld by the U.S. Court of Appeals here.

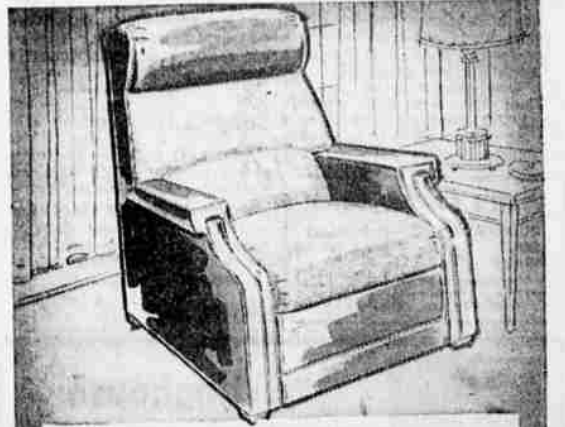

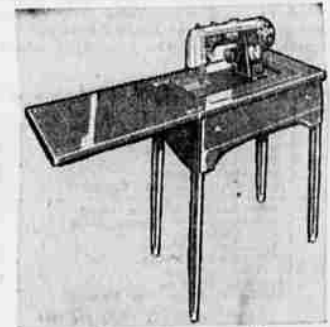

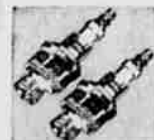
