

### U. S. Helicopters Coveted By Reds

WASHINGTON (AP)—A million-dollar Soviet purchase of U. S. helicopters may be the first tangible commercial outcome of Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev's visit with President Eisenhower.

Vladimir S. Alkhimov, commercial counselor for the Soviet Embassy, indicated here the Soviets want two and probably three of the choppers which so delighted Khrushchev when Eisenhower took him riding.

Khrushchev said he wanted the Eisenhower version—and that is what his purchasing agents are after, even though it's likely to cost a tidy sum.

The commercial model of the Sikorsky S-55 helicopter Eisenhower uses sells for around \$200,000. But with extras added, as in the two craft supplied for presidential flights by the Army and Marine Corps, the cost mounts closer to \$400,000.

These planes boast such niceties as bullet-proof fuel tanks, air-conditioning, soundproofing and special communications gear. And the Soviets want to match this on the craft for Khrushchev.

### Firm Willing To Go It Alone

WASHINGTON (AP)—An officer of Pacific Gas & Electric Co. said here he would recommend his company and its subsidiaries carry out alone, if necessary, a project to import Canadian gas.

James S. Moulton, vice president of PG & E and the Pacific Gas Transmission Co., was asked at a Power Commission hearing what would happen if the commission granted the PGT permit but denied applications of Pacific Northwest Pipeline Corp. and Montana Power Co.

PGT proposes to build a pipeline from the Canadian border to the California-Oregon boundary to deliver 400 million cubic feet of gas daily to PG & E.

The pipeline also would transport an additional 130 million cubic feet daily for delivery to Pacific Northwest.

Another PG & E subsidiary in Canada would buy the gas for delivery to California, plus another 30 million cubic feet daily for ultimate resale to Montana Power Co.

Moulton said he could not predict what action his company's directors would take if the Pacific Northwest and Montana applications were denied, but he would recommend that the permit be accepted.

In that event, he said, there would be excess capacity in the pipeline that could be used to supply gas to Sand Point, Idaho, Klamath Falls and Bend, Ore., and other communities along the proposed route of the line.

### Swiss Produce Tank For Defense In Alpine War

BERN, Switzerland (AP)—Now that you've seen the compact car, meet the compact tank.

This weapon combines a maximum of mobility and armed power with a minimum of weight. Its planners and makers say it is better suited than any other known type of tank to wage war in the mountainous territory of this Alpine republic.

The project of the compact tank, officially the P22, dates back eight years, when the Swiss military worked on the first blueprints. It was built by Switzerland's 10 biggest engineering concerns.

It is designed to defend this Alpine republic against an aggressor in a nonnuclear war. Any potential attacker would be bigger and more powerful than this country but the Alps make a formidable barrier. The Swiss are confident they could hold out against an enemy superior in numbers.

Without its guns, the compact tank is 21 feet long, 10 feet wide, 8 1/2 feet high and weighs 35 tons. It is built for a crew of four, is driven by a water-cooled V8 diesel engine developing 500 horsepower, and can go 20 miles an hour or climb a maximum gradient of 70 per cent.

It can easily go over obstacles 2 1/2 feet high, cross ravines 9 feet wide and drive through water 3 1/2 feet deep.

MUNICH, Germany (AP)—The Ukrainian anti-Communist leader, Ukrainian Bandera, 50, found dead after a mysterious fall last Thursday, died of poisoning, Munich police announced.

A spokesman said it appeared the noted guerrilla chief committed suicide but that the homicide squad has not completed its investigation.

Friends of Bandera said he might have been assassinated. They insisted foul play was involved.
