### Solon Fears Loss Of Two Continents

PENDLETON (AP)—Sen. Richard Neuberger (D-Ore) today said Asia and Africa will become parts of the communist bloc if the United States fails in its foreign aid mission.

Neuberger said the United States must "bolster the living standards, medical needs and literacy rates of those underdeveloped lands."

In remarks prepared for the Pendleton Chamber of Commerce, Neuberger said "the Republican administration has embraced the foreign aid and reciprocal trade programs of its Democratic predecessors."

Neuberger said his mail from Oregon voters have indicated his support of the Eisenhower foreign aid program has not been popular.

However, the senator said, "the fate of the free world is too important a matter to be left to partisan politics."
