

Aviation Workers Approve Contract

NEOSHO, Mo. (AP) — A two-year contract has been approved by employees at the Neosho plant of the Rockwell International Division of North American Aviation.

Local 1070, United Auto Workers, voted Sunday night at a meeting attended by about 300 of the 600 workers affected in the Neosho plant.

The contract provides wage increases and fringe benefits totaling 15 to 20 cents an hour; plus an improved insurance plan, continuation of cost-of-living allowance, a revised pension program, and the first extended layoff benefits in the industry.

Under the layoff program, a worker will get \$50 for each year of service up to a maximum of \$500 if he is laid off because of production cutbacks.

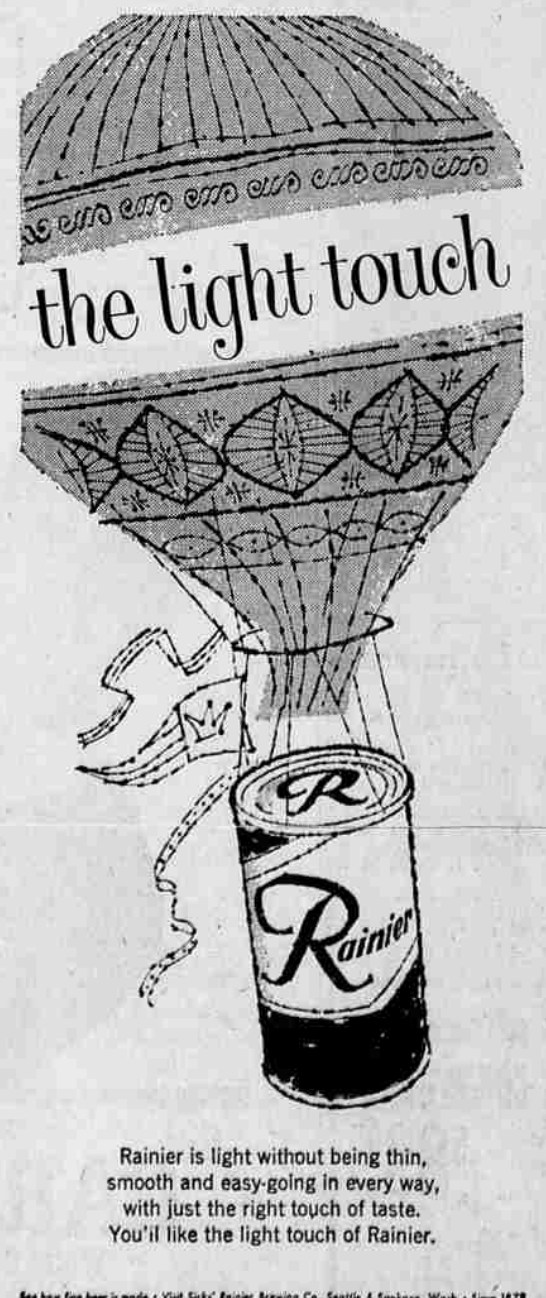

Bellamy Served Strike Summons

NEW YORK (AP) — Ralph Bellamy, president of Actors Equity Assn., was served today with a summons in a 2½-million-dollar suit brought by the League of New York Theaters against the performers union for damages suffered in the shutdown of Broadway theaters.

Bellamy, who arrived from Hollywood Sunday, was dressed as the late President Franklin D. Roosevelt when he received the summons. He was posing for still pictures at the Roosevelt house, one of the locations for the movie "Sunrise at Campobello," which he stars.

Bellamy expressed hope Sunday the blackout of 22 legitimate theaters would end soon, with a victory for actors equity.

"It doesn't make sense to close shows that are drawing \$50,000 and \$60,000 a week," he said.

There was rising optimism on both sides of the dispute as tempers cooled over the weekend, and some possibility that a solution might be reached by the end of this week.

Portland To Select Merrykhana Queen

PORTLAND (AP) — The Merrykhana queen of the 52nd annual Portland Rose Festival will be picked today. The Merrykhana Parade is scheduled Tuesday night in the rising tide of festival week events.

The big week of festival events got underway appropriately Sunday when the Rose Festival Junior Court, assisted by Royal Rosarians, planted roses in Peninsula Park.
