CARACAS, Venezuela (AP) — Doctors gave up hope today for Andres Cova Salas, leader of Fidel Castro's "28th of July" movement in Venezuela, who was shot five times Wednesday by police. The police said Cova Salas tried to bar them from his home when they sought to question him about a demonstration Tuesday sponsored by his organization. The demonstration ended in a riot in which one person was killed and 13 wounded.

Air Defense Group Adds New Region

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo. (AP) — A new U.S. Army Air Defense Command region in the Pacific Northwest has been added to the command's nation-wide regional boundaries, it was announced Wednesday. The command said the addition was a principal change in the re-alignment of its regional bounda-

ries to make them conform more closely with boundaries of the North American Air Defense Command. The Northwest region will be known as the 7th Region and will have its headquarters at McChord Air Force Base near Tacoma, Wash.

Ike Will Visit Scout Jamboree

DENVER, Colo. (AP) — President Eisenhower decided to pay a visit today to the Boy Scout Jamboree near Colorado Springs, 50 miles south of Denver. Eisenhower, relaxing in Colorado for a few days after attending the Republican National Convention in Chicago, arranged to travel by automobile to the encampment of almost 57,000 scouts from all sections of the country. James C. Hagerty, White House press secretary, said the President had no plans to make a speech. Eisenhower, who is honorary president of the Boy Scouts, plans to return to Denver immediately after touring the encampment. It was in this Colorado capital that Eisenhower eight years ago this month was planning the political campaign that took him to the White House.

leaders of the area. Attorney George Neuner was host. Neuner conducted an informal meeting at which he introduced Belton, speaking of him as "the type of public servant we should have in all our offices."

Treasury Fund — Oregon has money in the treasury, Belton said. He reported that "a surplus now is building," but that no prediction of the size of the surplus can be made. "It will depend upon the state's economy during the remainder of the year," he said.

He also told the group that Oregon's credit is excellent. "Our bonds are in demand and are commanding a high rate of interest," he said. He warned, however, that "as bonds go up, interest goes down," extreme care should be used in the issuance of more bonds.

Attractive Bonding — Bonding often is attractive, he asserted, because federal matching funds are available. "But the only difference I can see between state bonds and federal bonds is that federal money comes out of another pocket," Belton said. "There is only one source of money—taxation."

The greatest danger to either federal or state economy, he declared, is found in possible failure to maintain a stable, sound economy.

Belton served 22 years in the Oregon Legislature from Clackamas County—two years in the House of Representatives and 20 years in the Senate. His legislative experience was particularly directed toward the field of public finance. He served on committees of taxation, ways and means, public finance and banking. Because of his experience in the field of state finances, he was appointed by Gov. Mark Hatfield when the office of state treasurer became vacant the first of the year. He was successful at the primary election in May in securing the Republican nomination.

Belton was accompanied to Roseburg by Mrs. Belton and their son, John.

Keynoter Picked To Nominate Lodge

CHICAGO (AP) — Rep. Walter H. Judd of Minnesota, the Republican keynoter, will place before the convention tonight the name of Henry Cabot Lodge as the prospective GOP vice-presidential candidate. Vice President Richard M. Nixon said today that Judd would make the nominating speech. Nixon spoke to newsmen as he entered the Morrison Hotel for a "Sunny-Side up Breakfast" for Republican women. The vice president also disclosed that he will be introduced for his acceptance speech tonight, as the GOP presidential candidate, by New York Gov. Nelson A. Rockefeller. Nixon will speak without a text in accepting the Republican presidential nomination tonight. This announcement was made today by his press secretary, Herbert G. Klein, who said that not even advance excerpts would be available. Nixon frequently has said he feels he can do his best speaking job without having to read a prepared text. The talk is tentatively set for 9 p.m. Central Daylight Time.

Interim Committee Sets Labor Meet — The Oregon Legislative Interim Committee on Labor-Management Relations will hold public meetings in Bend and Eugene during the month of August. According to chairman of the interim committee, Harry Boivin, the purpose of the meeting is to provide the public with an opportunity to discuss their views of unfair labor practices and workmen's compensation.

Boivin, a Democratic senator from Klamath Falls, said the hearings will center around 15 sections of a suggested labor-management relations bill which the committee has been analyzing for 10 weeks. The committee will meet in Bend on Aug. 8 and in Eugene on Aug. 9 and 10. The Aug. 10 meeting in Eugene will be conducted by Oregon Senate President Walter J. Pearson (D-Multnomah County) and will be concentrated on workmen's compensation legislation.

Heart Attack Fatal To Young Geologist

BAKER (AP) — A heart attack caused the death of a 24-year-old man on a geological expedition in the mountains near here, the coroner's office reported Wednesday. The victim was William J. Horner of Libertyville, Ill. He died Monday in the wilderness 50 miles northwest of here on an expedition for the Phelps-Dodge Co. of Douglas, Ariz. It took 18 men, working in shifts, to bring out his body.

Two Hillcrest Inmates Escape While On Picnic

SALEM (AP) — Two inmates of the state's Hillcrest School for Girls escaped Wednesday while on a picnic at Taylor's Grove, on the North Santiam River east of Salem, the Board of Control announced. The girls, in a party of 15, are Jean Stevens, 16, Multnomah County, and Judy Chitwood, 17, Lane County.
