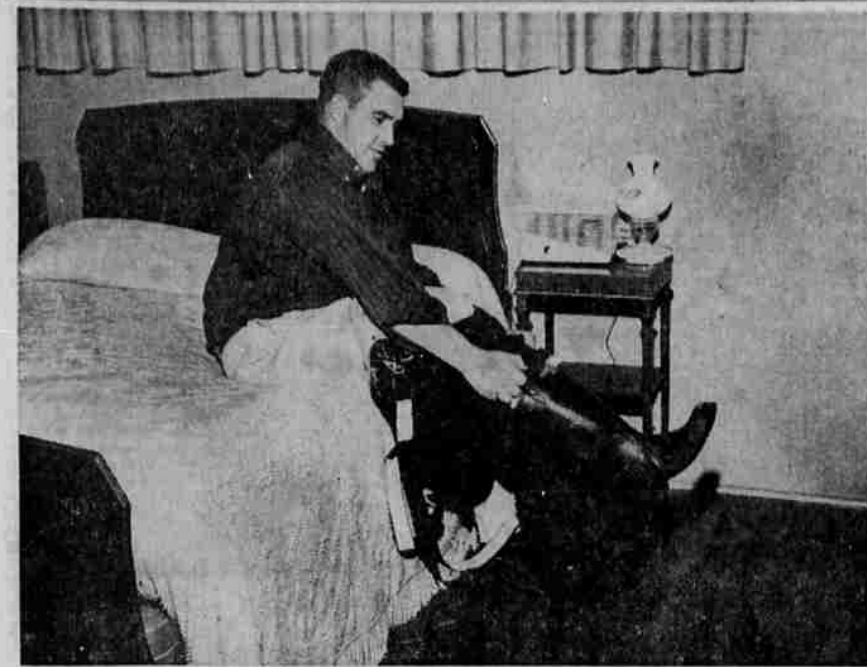


NW AIRLINES PLANE CRASHES IN MONTANA
