# Merely Players Choose Mystery

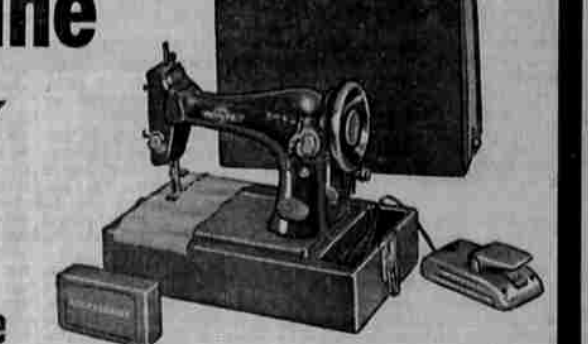
Roseburg's Merely Players, local amateur theater group, will present "Night Must Fall," a mystery-drama, at their next play, Larry Kingin, president, announced today.
