

Tot Is Cheerful Despite Prospect Of Motionless Christmas Season

Home again after spending Thanksgiving in the hospital, but with prospects of Christmas flat on his back with both legs in traction, is the bittersweet story of Michael Roger Standridge, 20-month-old son of Mr. and Mrs. Emmitt Standridge of Tiller.

Some two weeks ago, Michael was standing on a child's rocking chair when he slipped on his brother's toy gun and fell to the floor, fracturing the bone in his upper left leg. He spent eight days in Forest Glen Hospital in Canyonville and now faces another month in his crib with both legs fastened securely at right angles to his body.

Michael is one of a set of triplets, a brother, Merlin, and sister, Mary, completing the threesome. He has another brother, Emmitt

Louis and two other sisters, Debra and Ruth. Ruth is in the second grade at the Tiller-Drew School.

Mrs. Standridge says that Michael remains cheerful and is a good little patient, despite his discomfort and the immobility of his position. He has little appetite, and she says he is losing weight, evident in a comparison with his triplet brother.

Partly to brighten Michael's days, but also in response to enthusiastic urging of the other youngsters, the Standridges set up and trimmed a Christmas tree early this week.

The family lives in the former Scott home, about four miles upriver from Tiller.

Tiller Ranger Station Personnel Helps In Study Of Rain Beetles

Cooperating with the OSC Department of Entomology at Corvallis, personnel of the Tiller Ranger Station have been on the lookout for specimens of rain beetles, and two shipments of the insects have been made by the South Umpqua District in recent weeks, reports News-Review correspondent Mrs. Milton Hammersly.

Creations of curious habits, they make observation difficult, and are known to be destructive to fruit trees when, as grubs, they feed on the roots, and they are suspected of being guilty of forest damage also. Such suspicion sparked the present intensive study.

Rain beetles are large, roundish scarab beetles, about the size of a quarter or 50-cent piece, black or brown or reddish-brown in color, may be two-toned, often with yellowish hairs on body. They have short horns on the head.

Rain Brings Flight
The males are in flight from September to January, after the fall rains. They fly in the very early morning hours, often before dawn, but may fly during the day on overcast or drizzly days. They fly slowly, close to the ground, often making a buzzing sound, as they search for the burrows in the soil opened by the wingless females.

If it is established that they are responsible for damage to young trees planted in reforestation programs, control may pose difficult problems, for the grubs live for 10 to 13 years in the soil before becoming adults.

Six common species of rain beetles are known from Oregon, mostly from the Coast Range and western slopes of the Cascades bordering the Willamette Valley. One species found in Sherman County extends into sage brush country along the John Day River. Beetles are found most commonly in clearings in Douglas fir or ponderosa pine forests.

Skunks Like Beetles
Skunks feed largely on rain beetles in the fall and often the first indication of rain beetles are signs of skunks digging and wing covers of beetles skunks have eaten.

Following receipt of the first shipment from the Tiller area, Dave Fellin of the OSC Department of Entomology wrote Ranger Hillard M. Lillgren expressing appreciation for the help and noting that it was surprising to learn that

the local species was flying so late in the fall. Another shipment was sent when more beetles were found following the first snow in mid-November.

Fellin considered the local specimens of sufficient importance to his study to request immediate notification next time they were observed in flight so an attempt could be made to collect females. All specimens received have been males.

Grocery Store Clerks Ask Christmas Closing

PORTLAND (AP)—An estimated 1,000 Portland grocery store clerks held a mass meeting today and asked their employers to "comply with the spirit of Christmas" by closing on Christmas Sunday.

Gordon Swope, a business representative of the Food and Drug Clerks Union, said a minority of Portland food stores had told their workers they planned to be open on Christmas Day, a Sunday. The legal holiday is Monday.

The clerks in their meeting adopted a resolution calling on all stores to close on Sunday as well as on the legal holiday for Christmas. Swope said this had been the practice in Portland in past years when Christmas fell on Sunday.

The resolution asked the public to help in reversing the plan of some of the stores to be open.

"Christmas has always been observed in Portland as a family day, free from commercialism except for the most essential services," Swope said.
