

# Jim Allen Provides Punch As Pirates Down Wildcats

Forward Jim Allen provided the Glendale Pirates with the punch, 29 points to be exact, to down the Glendale Wildcats 65-54 Friday night.

The lanky forward standing at 6'3" proved to be more than the Wildcats could handle as he was deadly from the field collecting 13 two-pointers. Jim Allen was also rugged under the boards using his height to grab the rebounds before the shorter Wildcats could reach the ball.

Blevins Hits 18

Helping Jim Allen in the scoring column for the Pirates was forward Glen Blevins who picked up 18 points in the victory over the Wildcats. Bob Allen helped the Pirates cause with eight points from his guard position.

Forward John Hatfield led the Wildcats with 14 points followed by guard Darrell Sellers who accounted for 11 points in the loss.

The battle between the Wildcats and the Pirates was a rough affair with the first quarter ending in an 18-18 deadlock. Glendale picked up five points on the Wildcats to lead 35-28 at halftime. Jim Al-

len set the pace in the second quarter for the Pirates as he swished 10 counters.

Add To Margin

At the end of a hard-fought third period the Pirates had added another two points on their margin by outscoring the Wildcats 17-15. Early in the final stanza the Wildcats tied the score only to see the Pirates end with a rally that gave them the 65-54 victory.

Field goals gave the Pirates the win as the Glendale cagers connected with the hoop 27 times while the Wildcats hit only 20. From the foul line the Wildcats hit 14-24 compared to 11-23 for the Pirates.

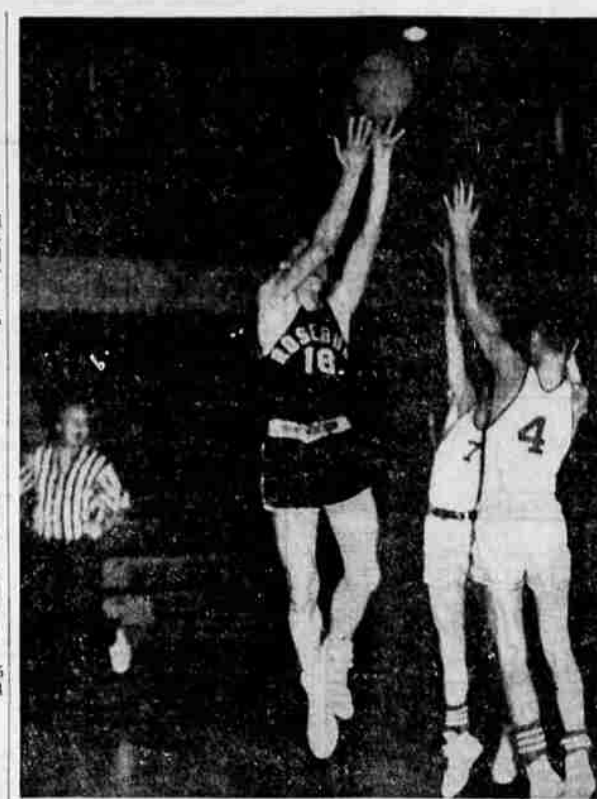
Sport 6-1 Mark

Winter steelhead appear to be about the only fish traversing the North Umpqua River with 283 of them counted at the Winchester Dam Counting Station from Dec. 16-31.

The 283 counted in the last half of December brings the total run to 1,281 for the season.

Fall chinook and silver salmon are still being counted in the river but they are few and far between.
