Bone Cancer Fatal To Prineville Lad

PRINEVILLE (AP)—Ten-year-old Larry Cooper died of bone cancer in Prineville Memorial Hospital Sunday.

The boy had received get-well cards from all over the United States and other parts of the world during the last months of his illness. An appeal went out shortly before Christmas saying Larry would like to get Christmas cards and other greetings.

The response was tremendous, his family said. He received an autographed baseball from the San Francisco Giants and an autographed football from the San Francisco 49ers.

Members of his family said the greetings helped him during the painful final days of his illness. He was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Vester Cooper of Prineville, who have five other surviving children.

Teeter Improving

MEDFORD (AP)—The condition of Alva Ernest Teeter, 60, Roseburg, who lost both legs under a Southern Pacific freight train here Feb. 11, was reported good today.

Hospital attendants said he had been improving.

Teeter was coupling cars when he fell and was run over.

Court Reinstates Beck's Indictment

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Supreme Court Monday reinstated an indictment charging Dave Beck, former teamsters union president, violated the Taft-Hartley Act by accepting a \$200,000 loan from trucking interests.

U. S. District Judge Sidney Sugarman in New York ordered dismissal of the indictment on Feb. 18, 1960.

He also dismissed accusations against two trucking companies and three companies named in the indictment.

Justice Frankfurter delivered the 8-1 decision. Justice Stewart dissented on the ground the high court should decide whether the loan came within proscriptions of the law.

Sugarman ruled that a Taft-Hartley law amendment in 1959, to prohibit passage of loans or other things of value between an employer and a union official, did not apply to the Beck loan which was made in 1954.

The Justice Department, appealing directly to the Supreme Court, argued that the 1947 Taft-Hartley law covered the transaction by making it unlawful for an employer to pay or deliver to a union official "any money or other thing of value."

Durno Introduces Agate Dam Bill

WASHINGTON (AP)—Construction of the Agate Dam and Reservoir as an addition to the Talent Division of Rogue River Basin reclamation project in Oregon would be authorized by a bill introduced in Congress today by Rep. Edwin R. Durno, R-Ore. Cost of the work was estimated at \$1,802,000.

The dam and reservoir would be on Dry Creek near Medford. The development would include an earth fill dam 73 feet high and 3,670 feet long on Dry Creek and a low diversion dam on Antelope Creek.

Senate Approves Change In Name

By PAUL W. HARVEY, JR., SALEM (AP)—The Senate today passed a bill to change the name of Oregon State College to Oregon State University. It goes to the governor.

Sen. Andrew J. Naterlin, D-Newport, cast the only vote against the bill. He explained that because of OSC's poor basketball showing over the weekend, the name should be changed to "Oregon State Prep School." OSC lost twice to Idaho.

Sen. Monroe Sweetland, D-Milwaukie, said that of the 20 land grant colleges in the nation, OSC would be the 19th to become a university. He said the change would give the Corvallis institution added prestige among education leaders.

Meanwhile, Gov. Mark Hatfield and Republican legislative leaders agreed on a plan to reappportion to the legislature by making only slight changes. P. F. Montgomery, Eugene, House Republican leader, said.

Senate Approves Envoy To Canada

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Senate confirmed today President Kennedy's nomination of Livingston T. Merchant, foreign service career officer, as ambassador to Canada.

He also gave voice vote approval to Kennedy's nominations of three assistant secretaries of state—Brooks Hays of Arkansas for congressional relations, Harlan Cleveland of Syracuse, N.Y., for international organization affairs and Northaskan William J. Crockett for administration.

Kennedy Names Army Assistants

WASHINGTON (AP)—President Kennedy today nominated two assistant secretaries of the Army.

He picked Richard S. Morse, 49, Abington, Mass., to handle Army research and development and William F. Schaub to be in charge of defense management. Both are subject to Senate confirmation.

Morse now is director of research and development for the Army. Schaub is chief of the Budget Bureau's military division.
