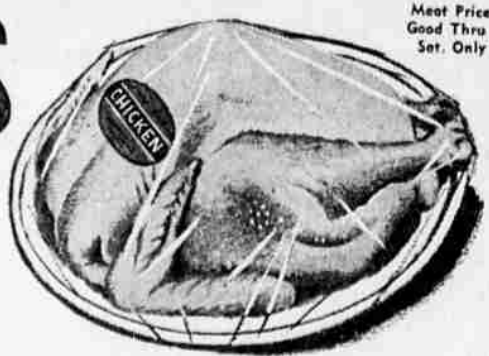

Circuit Court

Judgments

Floyd Githens Investment Co. vs. Jack Coleman and William Prokssel. Plaintiff granted judgment against defendant Coleman for \$27,305, plus attorney fees, in foreclosure proceeding. Defendant Prokssel granted judgment dismissing the action as to him and awarding him costs in the amount of \$14. The equitable defenses contained in Prokssel's first and second affirmative defense and counterclaim are dismissed. The case came on for trial Jan. 3 before Circuit Judge Charles S. Woodrich. The court having heard testimony of witnesses and argument of counsel rendered a decree dismissing the equitable defense and remanded the action to the law side of the court for trial on its merits. Counsel for plaintiff moved for order directing the jury to return verdict in favor of the plaintiff and against defendant Coleman and Prokssel, which motion was granted to Coleman. Counsel for Prokssel moved for a directed verdict against the plaintiff, whereupon the court removed the matter from consideration of the jury, and upon instructions the jury returned a verdict in favor of the plaintiff and against Coleman. Final action was based upon findings of fact and conclusions of law.

Eleanor Mendez vs. Ramon Mendez. Remaining suit money due in the amount of \$72.22 following divorce action reduced to judgment against defendant.

David H. Cameron, Department of Employment Commissioner, vs. Wesley Eugene Irwin. Plaintiff granted judgment for \$158.33, plus interest and costs on default of the defendant.

Leroy Ladd vs. Fred Olsfield, administrator of the estate of Iva M. Olsfield, deceased. Final decree, judgment for plaintiff granted in the sum of \$2,330 with foreclosure on property located in the Aaron Rose donation land claim ordered.

Clifford H. Gaylor vs. Jeff Shelton and Shellie L. Prince. Order of the court on stipulation of the parties, plaintiff to recover nothing and neither party recover costs and disbursements. Action dismissed. Defendants bond on appeal from district court discharged and bondsman exonerated.

Betty E. vs. George Alfred Gurney. Decree fixing division of property between couple. Property located in Sutherlin Land and Water Co. subdivision.

Dismissal
Clarence Zitek and Vera Zitek, doing business as Oakland Tavern, vs. Phoenix Assurance Co. of New York. On stipulation of the parties, case dismissed with prejudice and without costs as settled.

State vs. Jerl Higgins. Shoplifting charge dismissed, as defendant has pleaded guilty to a charge of larceny under \$75.

Order
Wayne C. and Marjorie Shrock vs. J. M. and Alberta Mettzer. Based upon the stipulation of the parties, custody of the minor children of the Shrocks shall be awarded to them, subject to the right of the defendants to retain physical possession of them until June 10. After that date the children must be delivered to the plaintiffs. The order was based upon a custody suit filed by the Shrocks to regain their children who had been placed in the care of the Mettzers, who are maternal grandparents.

Audrey vs. Floyd W. Brown. Order of the court restraining the defendant from molesting or interfering with the plaintiff. Defendant ordered to vacate the apartment of couple at 736 SE Douglas and enjoined from moving any property belonging to the plaintiff from the apartment.

YUMMY ROLLS
