

# Jerry Boucock Tosses No-Hitter For Tribe Jayvees

## Glendale's Pirates Roll To 6-0 Win Over Crater 9

Behind the one-hit pitching of Carl Burke and Bob Allen the Glendale Pirates rolled to a 6-0 victory over the Crater Jayvees in Douglas County's first night contest played Wednesday at Glendale.

Under the lights Burke handled the first four innings for the Pirates, giving way to Allen in the fifth. Burke struck out eight Crater batters and walked two as he pitched four innings of no-hit, no-run ball. Allen finished out the last three innings striking out seven and giving up only one hit to the invading Comet reserves.

Bob Jones came through with the only hit for the Crater nine as he beat out a single in the seventh inning to spoil Allen's no-hit relief performance.

The Pirates took the lead in the first innings with two tallies, then added two in the fourth and two in the sixth as they swept to the victory. Coach Clarence Friedrich used many subs as the Pirates took the lead and held on.

Alton Watson started the first rally for the winners as he led off with a safety. Stealing second Watson scored on an unsuccessful fielder's choice as Hubert Stewart reached first. O'Neil and Stewart were both clipped at the plate and Monte McLaughlin who had reached first on a fielder's choice stole second and third, then scored on a pass ball.

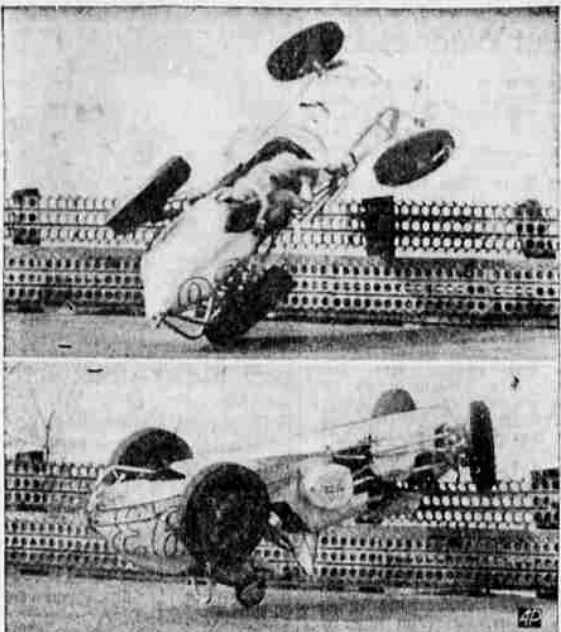
