McNamara To Pattern Budget On Missions

WASHINGTON (AP) — Secretary of Defense Robert S. McNamara plans to pattern his budget on military missions rather than on the individual needs of the separate armed services.

A paper outlining this new system is being circulated to the three services by Charles J. Hitch, Pentagon comptroller.

Hitch discussed the new budget plan Friday with newsmen. He did not mention the size of the budget to be presented to Congress next January.

The plan resembles one offered by Gen. Maxwell D. Taylor (ret.), former Army Chief of Staff, in his book, "The Uncertain Trumpet," published last year.

Hitch said the plan was to assemble the budget in "package" form. Each package would bring together for cost estimating purposes all items and operating expenses for one mission.

An example is the strategic mission, which would involve Air Force planes and missiles and Navy aircraft carriers and Polar ice submarines.

Committee To Conduct New Hearing On Morgan

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Senate Commerce Committee will hold another hearing May 2 on the nomination of Howard Morgan of Sisters, Ore., to be a member of the Federal Power Commission.

Morgan, a former Oregon public utilities commissioner, requested the hearing to answer an issue raised after his first appearance on April 11.

The issue is Morgan's apparent failure to disclose that he had been fined as a youth for getting into a fist fight. Morgan, when he applied for a job with the federal government in the 1940s, apparently did not list this arrest. The application form called for listing any past arrests or convictions, other than for minor traffic violations.

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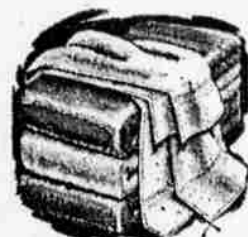


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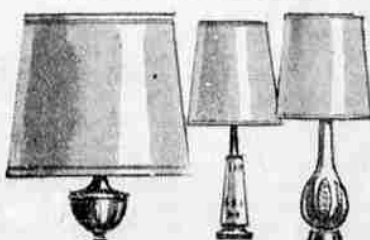
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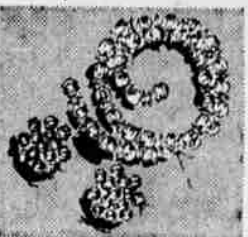
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
