

Four Roseburg Netmen Reach State Tourney Semi-Finals

Tribe Thincads Qualify 13 For District

Crunican Gives Outstanding Performance In Mile, 880

Roseburg Indians came through in the sub district track meet Friday at North Bend as they finished second in the number of District 5-A-1 berths won.

The Indians qualified for 13 positions in the District action May 18 at Springfield, trailing the Marshfield Pirates who qualified 18. The host Bulldogs took 11 district berths. Scoring for the top four in each event found the Pirates racking up 70 and two thirds points, the Tribe 42 points and the Bulldogs 38 and one third points.

Ray Palm, Mike Crunican and Ron Pinard were the leaders for the local thincads in the sub-district action.

Palm tied for the top leap in the high jump clearing the bar at five feet, eight inches. In the 120-

yard high hurdles Palm covered the distance in 15.1 for the second best time of the evening, trailing Ken Robinson of North Bend who had a clocking of 14.8. Palm finished with the third best time in the 180-yard low hurdles following Willie Smith of Marshfield and Robinson. Smith skinned over the obstacles in an even 20 seconds, while Robinson had a 20.3 and Palm a 20.5.

Crunican turned in the best times in the mile and 880-yard dash as he was the only double first place winner for the Indians. Crunican's time in the mile was 4:42.9, almost eight seconds under his earlier 4:50.5 clocking. In the 880 Crunican recorded a 2:06.8 to pace the field.

Pinard Places
Taking two third places to earn two berths in the district meet was Pinard as he placed in the 220-yard dash and the broad jump. Pinard ran the 220 in 23.6 and was third behind Gary Crabaugh of Marshfield and Bob Orr of North Bend who had identical 23.2 clockings. In the broad jump Pinard soared 20 feet, six and one-half inches as Smith turned in the top leap of 21 feet, five inches.

Bruce Long will also see action at the district meet as a result of his showing Friday. Long finished third in the 100-yard dash with a time of 10.3. Crabaugh and Bill Mattern of North Bend tied for the top clocking with 10.2 each.

Roseburg's top javelin tosser, Bob Welch, placed second in his specialty with a toss of 164 feet, eight and three-quarters inches. Team mate Pete Rutter had the third best throw, while Mike Morrissey of Marshfield tossed the spear 165 feet, 10 inches to win the event. Rutter's top throw measured 158 feet, eight and three-quarter inches.

Jon Counts had the third best distance in the shot put to earn a district berth. Counts put the shot 44 feet, two and one-half inches, while Dave Gould of 53 feet, six inches. Gould also recorded the top discus throw in the sub-district meet.

At Joelson was the final Indian placing in the top three in the individual events as he tied for third in the high jump clearing the bar at five feet, six inches. The Roseburg relay quartet composed of Long, Tom Thurber, Pin-

Oregon Frosh Nip Indian Nine, 4-1

Under the lights at Legion Field, the Roseburg Indians fell by a 4-1 count before the onslaught of the invading University of Oregon Frosh Friday.

Arjan Foote for the Indians and Fred Doerr for the Ducks engaged in a tight pitchers duel for the last six innings of the contest with each hurler giving up one run. The invaders capitalized on costly Tribe miscues in the first inning along with three singles to bring in three runs in what proved to be the winning rally.

As the game progressed the big question in the minds of the fans was who would win the strike out battle between the two pitchers. Both were mixing ball with fast balls to keep the hitters guessing, and both were sending most of the batters back to the dugout via the strike out route.

Doerr ended the contest with 13 strike outs to his credit, while Foote fanned 11 of the Ducking batsmen. Mixing his breaking curves with a hopping fast ball Foote set the visitors down in the second, third and fourth innings after getting off to a shaky start.

Going the distance for the Tribe, the lanky right-hander allowed six hits — all singles — to the Frosh and issued only three free passes. Although registering more strikeouts, Doerr suffered from streaks of wildness as he walked six batters and hit two more. Doerr, an ex-North Eugene star, found himself in trouble repeatedly throughout the game as the Indians left 12 runners stranded, and had base runners in every inning.

Avery Gets 1st Hit
In the hitting department the Indian fans had little to cheer about as the four hits were scattered. Gordon Avery was the first

vantage of two Roseburg errors and three singles in the first inning to come up with three runs. With two out Cal Dean singled and Gage Naudain was safe on the first base of the inning. Sandy Nosler then walked to load the bases after both runners had advanced on the second error of the inning. Bogner then drilled his single to center field driving in the first two runs, and Bruce Madsen followed with a single to left to score Nosler.

The Ducks were then held scoreless until the top of the seventh inning, and again it was an ex-Glide boy who did the damage. This time Wagner singled, stole second and advanced to third on a pass ball and raced home as the Indians mislaid the ball.

Roseburg's lone run came in the bottom of the seventh when Doerr issued three walks and a single. French led off with a walk, and with one out Avery walked. Lake followed with a blooper single to right field which loaded the bases. With two out Chuck Hiney worked his way for a free pass forcing French in from third and the rally ended with a strike out and the bases loaded.

The Indians had threats working several times, but could not come through with the hits when runners were aboard. In the first inning Avery was left stranded at second and Lake at first, while in the fifth frame the runners were left at third and first. The only time the visitors threatened and were stopped was in the sixth when the bases were loaded with two out before Foote struck out the opposing pitcher to end the inning.

Today the Indians have a double-header at North Bend with the Bulldogs starting at 1:30 p.m. The first game is set for seven innings and will count in the Midwestern League standings.

Three ex-Glide Wildcats were on the field for the Duckings as Les Bogner played in center field, Gene Wagner worked in left field and Dave Cellers handled the duties at second base. The three local aces each collected a hit as they accounted for half the Frosh's six base blows. Bogner's was the big hit of the game as he drove

to get a single hitting safely in the third inning. Two of the Indians' hits came in the fifth inning when Marv French and Jim Jarvis led off with back-to-back singles and French reached third before Doerr struck out two and got the next batter to ground out. The final hit came in the seventh inning rally as Ron Lake singled between three walks.

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Ex-Glide Horsehide Ace Is Third In SOC Batting

ASHLAND—Damien Rossetto, a sophomore from Weed, Calif., led Southern Oregon College hitters with a .400 batting average. It was announced this week as final statistics for the 1961 baseball season were released.

Bill Franks, ex-Glide and Roseburg Legion ace, ended the season third among the Red Raider batsmen. Franks collected five hits in 15 appearances at the plate competing in 14 games. Larry Hink, ex-Indian, hit a .143 for the Southern Oregon team seeing action as a pitcher and outfielder. Franks and Hink are both freshmen at Southern Oregon College this year.

Rossetto had the most hits, 28, in 70 times at bat in posting his squad-leading bat mark. He was one of five players hitting over .300 for the season. The others were John Cook, .370, Franks, .332, Dave Hughes, .316, and Joe Funderburg, .311.

Kerm McMenamy, one of three seniors who will graduate this June, led the team in runs-batted-in with 21, while batting .280.

J. Jarvis Leads Golfers To Win

The Roseburg Indian golfers took to the links Friday against the Corvallis Spartans and the South Eugene Axemen at the Roseburg Country Club course.

The Tribe lost to the Spartans by a 440-429 total, and won 429-410 over the Axemen. The win over the Axemen was the first victory the Indians under the tutelage of coach Roy Thompson have enjoyed this year.

Jim Jarvis was the low medalist for the afternoon's action as he shot a 73, one over par for the course. Friday was Jarvis' first time out in competition this year and he proved to be a whiz for the local team.

Three sophomores also turned in good performances for the Indians as Milt Dougherty shot an 84, Scott Campbell an 85 and Gregg Krewson an 86.

Steve Vrtiska, Corvallis' number two man, picked up a 77 for the top Spartan showing and Dave Hamaker had a 78 playing as the number one linksman for the Axemen.

The Indians will travel to Portland May 22-23 for the state prep golf tournament. Jarvis, Dougherty, Campbell and Krewson will probably make up the quartet of Roseburg golfers at the state action.

Mike Brundage, Howard Sohn, Don Lowe and Doug Green led the Roseburg Indians in the state tennis tournament now in progress at Corvallis as the local squad gained three of the eight semi-final positions.

The defending state boys' team champs will have two singles stars in action today in the semifinals and could end up first and second in the singles. Lowe and Green reached the semifinals for the local netmen in the doubles competition and look like they could be the team to beat.

Coach Al Hoffman was well pleased with the showing of all the boys he took to the tourney and feels that the Tribe has a good chance of repeating as the champions. The Indians held five of the six berths awarded to District 5 teams and made the most of three of them as they appear as the team to beat going into the semi-finals.

Brundage won three straight matches in the tourney in six sets, and during the six sets lost only six points as he easily handled his opponents. In the first round of play the defending singles champion rolled to a pair of 6-0 victories over Earl Burkhardt of Oregon City. Continuing to make use of his deadly serve Brundage returned to the Oregon State courts and downed Bruce Barnes of South Salem by set scores of 6-1 and 6-0.

Brundage Faces Orr
To advance to the semifinals Brundage clashed with Dave Shufford of North Salem and took an easy 6-1 victory in the first set, then edged the Viking star by a 6-4 count. Today Brundage will face Bud Orr of Grants Pass in the semifinals.

Roseburg's number two singles star, Sohn, won a first round victory over John Poppelwell of Marshfield by 6-1 and 6-2 decisions. Using his brilliant defensive play Sohn went on to down Bill Norgarden of Wilson of Portland by 6-1 and 6-0 set scores. In his bid for the semifinals North Bend upset the second seeded singles player of the tournament as he defeated Tom McCoy of The Dalles.

Sohn defeated the ranked ace by a 6-3 count in the first set, then displayed top form as he rolled to a 6-1 victory in the second set. In his three matches Sohn lost only nine games while he won the matches in six straight sets. In the semifinals today the number two Indian ace will clash with Bruce Metzger of Lake Oswego.

Metzger defeated Tom Kirk, the third singles entrant from Roseburg, in the first round in a three set match. After losing the first set 6-3, Kirk rallied to take a 6-4 victory, then lost the deciding by a 6-3 count. The loss eliminated Kirk from the tourney, while Metzger went on to gain the semifinals.

Doubles competition saw Lowe and Green exhibit their top form as they swept to victories in three straight matches to advance to the semifinals. The classy Roseburg duo had little trouble downing Mike Perovich and Mike Joran of Jefferson of Portland in the first round. Lowe and Green took easy 6-1 victories in two straight sets over the Jeff pair.

Continuing on their way Lowe and Green defeated Dick Black-

smith and Dick Newman of Grants Pass in a close 8-6 first set, then beat the Cavemen stars by a 6-2 count. In the third match the local pair was forced to go the limit to down Ed Jackson and Bob Morain of Madison of Portland by a 10-8 decision in the first set. Green and Lowe came back strong to take a 6-0 victory in the second set.

Jack Beaman and Don Harris opened with a victory for the Indians in the first round of play downing Dick North and Dick Rovang of North Bend. Beaman and Harris came back with 6-4 and 6-3 victories after losing the opening set. The pair of Tribesmen then fell before the pair of Jim Randall and Gary Hyland of Medford in the second round. The Black Tornado doubles combination rolled to 6-3 and 6-2 victories to eliminate Beaman and Harris from the tourney.
