Elkton Lodge Sets Event

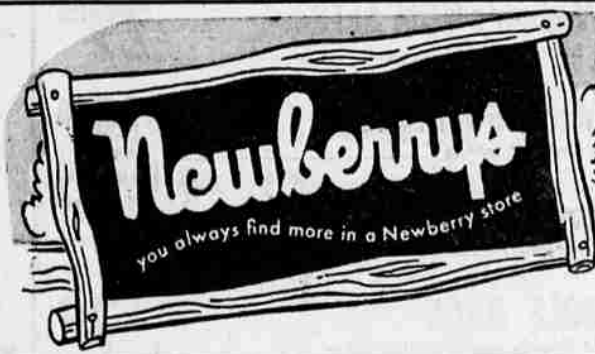
