Sailplane Begins Crossing Of U. S.

SEATTLE (AP) Fifty years ago the first powered plane crossing of the United States was completed in 49 days. Robert Fisher of Moses Lake, Wash., hopes to beat that time easily without a motor.

Fisher took off Wednesday on what will be, if his plans work out, the first cross-country flight in a motorless sailplane. He hopes to reach New York City in four weeks.

He had planned to get across the Cascade Mountains, but was unable to gain enough altitude. Three hours after taking off from the Auburn airport, about 18 miles south of here, he landed at Cumberland in the foothills.

Fisher is being accompanied on the trip by his wife and their sons, Dan, 13, and Dickie, 9, a nephew, 17, and the family dog. But don't worry, they're not all traveling in the sailplane. It carries only Fisher. The rest of the entourage is going in a station wagon equipped with two-way radio.

Rickey Out Of Danger

SUDBURY, Ont. (AP)—Baseball executive Branch Rickey is reported out of immediate danger but will remain hospitalized for between two and three weeks, hospital administrator Horace Snyder said today.

Rickey, 79-year-old father of baseball's farm system and former general manager of the St. Louis Cardinals, Brooklyn Dodgers and Pittsburgh Pirates, suffered his second heart attack in three years Tuesday.

Portland's Victory Skein Stretched To Four

The Portland Beavers, continuing their comeback after a 13-game losing streak, climbed into a tie for third place in the Coast

League Wednesday night with a 3-1 victory over Salt Lake City. It was the fourth straight win over the Bees, after the Beavers dropped the first three of the current series. The series will wind up tonight at Salt Lake with Mel Nelson (5-5) pitching for Portland against the Bees' ace, Bill Dailey (5-3).

Gene Oliver provided the victory Wednesday night. The first baseman swatted a bases-empty home run in the second inning, then drove in another run with a double in the eighth.

Portland's Clint Stark got the victory, although he needed help from reliever Ed Bauta in the eighth inning, when the Bees got their lone run.

Hawaii defeated Spokane twice 3-2 and 3-1.

The Seattle Rainiers gained first place in the Pacific Coast Baseball League early in the season by winning when they had to. Wednesday night they had to — and did.

Their backs to the wall after losing 10 of their last 15 games, the Rainiers held a paperthin edge over the Tacoma Giants, the No. 2 team and main beneficiary from the Seattle slump. Old pro Elmer Singleton took the mound, scattered four Tacoma hits for a 5-2 decision that widened Seattle's lead to two games.

The Vancouver Mounties, shaping up as the newest threat to both Seattle and Tacoma, split a twin bill with San Diego's skidding Padres and remained tied with Portland, six games out of first place. The Mounties handed

the Padres their sixth straight loss 8-7 on Howie Goss' 21st home run, then lost 6-1 on Gary Peters' five-hitter.

The Giants collected two of their four hits and both their runs off Singleton in the first inning. Ernie Bowman singled and Bob Farley cracked his sixth homer of the season. From then on the game was all Singleton's, the veteran righthander retiring the next 15 batters en route to his sixth win against three losses.

At Vancouver, the Padres went ahead 3-0 in the first inning of the opener on Joe Taylor's two-run homer. The Mounties tied it with two in the second and one in the third and went ahead with three in the fourth. San Diego tied it in the fourth and took the

lead in the sixth, but Vancouver won in the bottom of the seventh with Goss' one-on-one round-tripper.

The win went to Arnold Umbach, Vancouver's \$100,000 bonus baby. In the nightcap, Peters struck out 13 and walked five and the only Vancouver run was unearned.

The Spokane-Hawaii opener was a makeup for an earlier contest at Honolulu. The Islanders got only five hits but sharp fielding left eight Spokane runners on base. Julio Navarro allowed Spokane just four hits in the nightcap to post his fifth PCL win in seven starts. Hawaii won the series 5-3.

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
