Larry Flynn handled the pitching for Riverside in the 13-and-under game, while Flynn was effective on the mound, Mike Doyle drove in two runs for the winners.

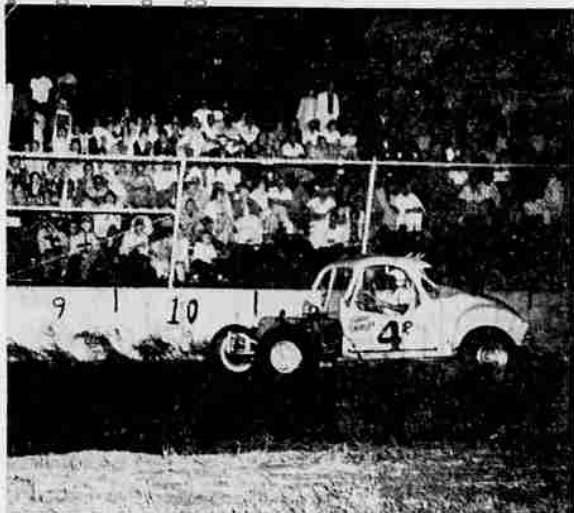
Winston-Dillard Wins

WIMBLEDON, England (AP)—Rod Laver of Australia crushed Charles (Chuck) McKinley of St. Louis today 6-3, 6-1, 6-4 for the men's singles title in the Wimbledon Tennis Championships.

The 20-year-old American, a sophomore at Trinity University in San Antonio, Tex., was no match for the bandy-legged, left-handed Australian, who will be 22 next month.

McKinley, eighth-seeded, started the match with bounce and confidence but his dash was soon dulled by the brilliant shot-making of the little Australian. Laver gave one of the finest exhibitions ever seen on the center court.

Sox Host Santiam Tonight At 8:15

A battle for second place in the final first-half standings of the Oregon State League looms tonight at Legion field when the Santiam Loggers invade the home of the Roseburg White Sox.

Roseburg and Santiam have identical 8-5 records for the first half of league play and go into tonight's makeup contest tied for second place. Game time at Legion Field is set for 8:15.

Saturday at 8 p.m. on the local diamond the Albany Merchants will open a three-game series against the Sox. Sunday's doubleheader between the two teams is set to start at 2 p.m. The three-game series with Albany opens the second half of league play.

As an added attraction preceding Saturday's game the Fremont 16-and-under team will host a Eugene squad at 8 p.m.

Whipple To Pitch
Bob Whipple will draw the starting nod for tonight's game against the Loggers, with Steve Clark and Mike Coen being held for relief. Saturday, Jim Smith will be on the mound for the local nine, while Clark and Coen are set for starting roles Sunday. Lefty Gene Wagner will be the mainstay of the bullpen against Albany as he has been during the last two series.

In an earlier game, the White Sox took a one-run decision over the Loggers, then had a double header rained out. Tonight's contest is a makeup of the rainout, but only one game will be played, since neither team can overtake the first-half winners, the Eugene Ducks.

The White Sox have a 1-2 record against Albany. The Sox traveled north for a three-game series against the Merchants and lost the Sunday doubleheader after

taking an easy win Saturday. Albany finished in a tie with the Cascade Emeralds for the first half of league play. Albany and Cascade sported identical 5-9 records.

Second Half Starts
The slate will be clean when the Sox take on Albany in the weekend series as the OSL is divided into two halves. The winner of the second half will meet the Ducks in a playoff series at the end of the regular season for the league crown.

The probable starting infield for the White Sox tonight will find Terry Marham at first base, Dave Cellers at second base, Jim Dietz at shortstop and either Rod Trask or Les Bogner at third base. In the outfield will be Ron Beamer in left, John Livingston in center and Rick Summers in right.

Sharing the catching duties for the White Sox in the four game stand will be Tom Myers and Dick McClain. Myers will be behind the plate tonight, with McClain scheduled to catch the first game of the Albany series.

McClain Leads
McClain is currently the leading hitter among the regulars with a .450 average. The husky catcher has 10 hits in 21 times at bat. Beamer has 14 hits in 31 at bats for a healthy .451 average, followed by Dietz with a .371 mark. Livingston and Bogner have identical .340 batting averages and lead in runs batted in with 13 and 11 respectively.

Coen is the leading Roseburg hurler with a 4-0 record, while Smith, Wagner and Livingston have 1-0 marks. Clark is 3-3 for the season, and Whipple has a 2-2 record on the hill. Three of the pitchers

also have top batting averages. Whipple is 5-10 at the plate, Wagner is 4-10 and Smith has a hit in his only official appearance as a hitter.

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North Umpqua Parks Do Big July Business

Three district ranger stations of the Umpqua National Forest—the Little River District, the North Umpqua (Steamboat) District and the Diamond Lake District, reported an overflow of all available camp and picnic grounds operated by the U. S. Forest Service, were filled to overflowing during the four-day Fourth of July holiday weekend.

Campers Overflow Sites
Jack Price, Little River district ranger, reported 120 campers filled the Wolf Creek, Twin Lakes and Lake of the Woods campgrounds plus 300 picnic parties. Price stated, "The bushes were filled with overflow campers, camping along streams and on the roadside." The Camera Club of Roseburg set up camp at the Quartz Mountain Guard Station Saturday through the Fourth. Little River foresters patrolled these areas during the four holidays.

Ronald Waitt, multiple-use supervisor of the North Umpqua District of the Umpqua National Forest, reported 300 campers at the six campgrounds under the supervision of the Steamboat Ranger Station. He stated the greatest percentage of the campers come from California. Even during regular weekdays, three-quarters of the campers are from that state.

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
