Army Reservists To Get Training

Thirty Douglas County men will join nearly 1,500 Army Reservists in the Northwest's 104th Timberwolf Division who leave Saturday for two weeks active duty training at Camp Roberts, Calif.

They are members of the U. S. BCT (basic combat training). Taking the trip will be 24 enlisted men and six officers under the command of Capt. Alexander W. Kennedy.

The men will remain at the sprawling camp near Paso Robles two weeks, training men who are in their final two weeks of eight-week boot camp.

The Timberwolf Division will chalk up several firsts during the 1961 summer encampment period. This is the first time the main body of the division will have traveled this distance for summer camp; it will be the first time

during its history as a reserve unit that it will be self-sufficient for two weeks training, with only a minimum of regular Army personnel for support; and it will be the first time since it became a training division in 1959, that it will take over the complete training for one week of regular Army recruits from nearby Ft. Ord.

Major Gen. Eugene C. Cushing, Vancouver, Wash., will be in command of the main body of troops during summer camp. He will be assisted by Brig. Gen. Snyder L. Peebles, Seattle, Wash., and Brig. Gen. William H. Prentice, Medford.

Units of the Timberwolf Division are located throughout Oregon and Washington — from the Canadian border to Klamath Falls, Oregon, with 104th headquarters at Vancouver Barracks, Wash.

One of the 13 Army Reserve training divisions in the nation, the 104th is a link of the U. S. defense chain.

Local Red Cross Worker Serves In Fire Disaster

Mrs. Russell Rummel of Roseburg, because of recent training in disaster work, has been sent to the Fresno and Yosemite Park forest fire disaster area in California.

A Red Cross volunteer disaster worker, she has been working this week with the organization at the fire, after having been flown to San Francisco and taken to the fire scene by Red Cross staff car.

Mrs. Rummel was chosen by the Red Cross last spring to attend a disaster school in San Francisco. She is now on call to go to any disaster area in the United States to rehabilitate disaster victims. The California fire is the first disaster to which Mrs. Rummel has been called. She expects to remain in California for two or three weeks.

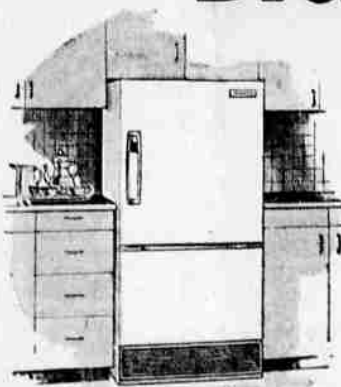
