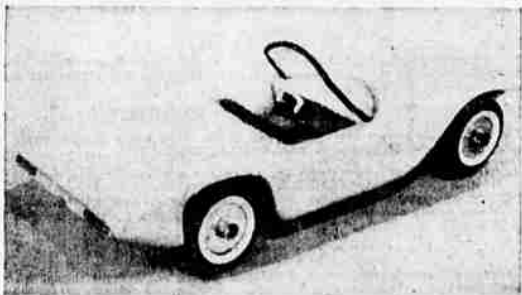

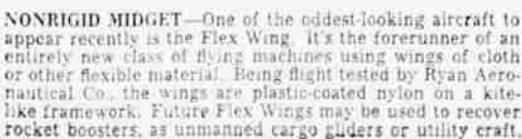

the women students said they earned at least half of their own school expenses.

The totals are slightly above the figures reported in the survey in past years.

Only 8 per cent of the men and 33 per cent of the women said

they were totally dependent on their families.

Summer job savings, part-time work during school, and careful management of funds during the year make it possible for any student to go to college "if he or she wants to badly enough and can handle college work," OSU officials say.

Students earned a record \$146,255 last year at jobs found through the university employment service, it was reported. All told, some 2120 men students and 524 women students and student wives found part-time work through the office. The student loan fund office provided financial help for many students also.

Evidence that working doesn't cut achievement in college unduly is shown in figures compiled by Registrar D. T. Ordeman on students nominated for all-school honors and awards. Coeds nominated averaged at least 50 per cent self-supporting and men, 70 per cent self-supporting.

Mary Lindsell of Roseburg, Delia Davidson from Winston, and Marijean McClure of Idleyld Park, all have been accepted to enter the basic degree nursing program at the University of Oregon School of Nursing this fall.

They will be among a class of 103, the largest entering class in the school's history. The class also shows a 25 per cent increase over last year's record class of 84, according to director Jean E. Boyle. Graduates of the basic degree program receive a bachelor of science degree in nursing and are eligible to be registered nurses upon passing the State Board of Nursing examination.

Joseph G. Friedly of Portland, administrative officer of the Bureau of Land Management with 32 years and six months service has resigned at Portland.

relieved at Portland, Oregon. Friedly began his long career in government with the United States General Land Office at Denver in 1921 where he served as an administrative assistant. He transferred to Portland in 1928 at the time the O&C Administration was being organized to manage and protect O&C forest lands in Western Oregon. Friedly's task at that time, under Walter Horning, the forester in charge, was to handle the administration of staffing, equipping, and supplying several Civilian Conservation Corps Camps. These camps, all of which were located in the forest lands, had telephone lines, fire lookouts, and fought fires and blisters rust in the O&C area.

In 1946 when the Bureau of Land Management was formed by consolidating the General Land Office with the Grazing Service, and the O&C Administration, Friedly became the administrative officer for the new region which consisted of the public domain lands and the O&C lands in Oregon, and the public domain lands in Idaho and Washington. When headquarters at Portland were moved to Seattle, he was organized in 1951. Friedly continued in his post in charge of administrative affairs for the area including Oregon, California and Washington. In the 1961 reorganization in which the area offices were eliminated, Friedly was appointed head of the field administrative office at

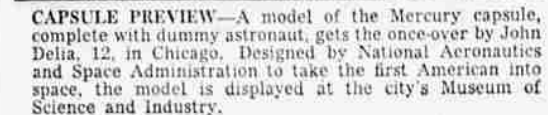
