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## Springfield Operator Involved In Truck Move

SALEM (AP) — Part of the trucking authority of Alonzo B. and Ruth V. Ryals, owners of Junction City Transfer Co., Harrisburg, will be transferred Aug. 14 to Glenn A. Chamberlain, Springfield.

State Public Utility Commissioner Jonel C. Hill said the decision authorizing the transfer results from an analysis of records of four separate hearings dating back to Aug. 15, 1960.

Rival trucking firms had protested the transfer, arguing that Chamberlain had built up the business in an attempt to avoid a restriction in permit authority. Hill said intent to avoid restriction was not proven. He said Ryals hired Chamberlain, a trucker with 27 years experience, after an accident made it necessary to get help.
