

Consumers To Find Concord Grapes On Market This Week

Among fall fruits on the market this week, consumers in the Pacific Northwest will find regular Concord grapes are available for making distinctively flavored grape preserves.

In table grapes, Tokays are the best choice this week, with the supply of these popular red grapes at its peak during the latter part of September. Tokays are reasonably priced. However, there is a wide range in color and the more brilliantly colored grapes often command a slightly higher price.

Supplies of Thompson seedless grapes are declining, and prices vary considerably. Other varieties of grapes, including black Ribiers, and green Muscats, are in the moderate price group.

Hale and Elberta peaches, as well as Bartlett pears, are in lighter supply this week, and most sales are expected to be on a per-pound basis while storage supplies of these fruits continue to come to market. Good quantities of Italian prunes are still available.

Washington apples are being harvested in increasing volume now, and a good supply of excellent quality Jonathans is on the market at moderate prices.

While watermelons are quite reasonably priced, other melons are generally in the medium price range this week with prices varying for cantaloupes, casbas, honeydews and Persians.

Oranges, nectarines, pineapples and limes are other moderately priced fruits. Consumers will find avocados, strawberries and grapefruit are in light supply and relatively high in price.

Among the wide array of fresh vegetables on the market now, potatoes, carrots and cauliflower are excellent values. Corn prices continue to be attractive, although harvesting is about over. Bunch beets, spinach and squash of all types are very reasonably priced.

Local celery, cucumbers, lettuce and other salad items, including radishes and green onions, are of good quality, and prices are low. Tomatoes, however, are in the moderate price range.

With supplies much shorter this week, green beans have shown an increase in price this week, putting them in the moderate-buy group along with broccoli, eggplant, mushrooms and dry onions. You will find medium size onions are lower in price than the large onions which are preferred for slicing purposes.

In the meat departments, consumers will find features on a variety of beef cuts this week. Lamb and poultry prices remain steady, with top values in all types of chicken and turkeys. Pork prices are still relatively high, but market reports indicate we can look for a slight decline in coming weeks.

This is the last week to enjoy fresh halibut this season, and it is moderately priced. There is a good supply of cod, sole and red snapper available as well as ocean smelt for fish entrees. In seafood, Pacific oysters are on the plentiful list.

No Added Troops Will Go To Europe

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Army has called 73,000 more reservists and National Guardsmen to the colors to give the United States a bigger stick in the days of crisis. But Secretary of Defense Robert S. McNamara says there are no plans to send any more Army divisions to Europe now.

The men called up Tuesday—including two National Guard divisions—will report Oct. 15. McNamara described the action as another readiness measure in the light of world conditions. Asked if it indicated a worsening in the Berlin situation, he replied: "No, I think not."

The call to active duty went out to two National Guard divisions—the 32nd Infantry of Wisconsin and the 49th Armored of Texas—and to 249 reserve and guard support units.
