

Sutherland Set For Bulldogs

Sutherland's Bulldogs will host the arch-rival Oakland Oakers Friday night at 8 in what is billed as "all-ways a tough battle" in the Umpqua Valley League competition.

Going into this year's clash the Oakers and the Bulldogs have identical 1-1 records. However, Sutherland's win came last week by a 13-7 score over Douglas in league play, while Oakland's victory was in a non-league encounter with Powers. The Bulldogs will be fresh from their victory, and the Oakers will be trying to bounce back after losing a 2-1 contest to Riddle last week in UVL action.

Whenever Oakland and Sutherland clash, anything can happen as the two schools are located only 12 miles apart and exhibit a strong competitive spirit in all sports. Last year the Bulldogs managed to defeat Oakland 4-0, and the Oakland 11 will be out to avenge that loss.

Spark Bulldogs
Fullback Paul Treman is expected to spark the Bulldogs' attack as he did last week against Douglas. Treman scored a touchdown which was earlier credited to Don Sweet and bounced his PAT attempt off the crossbar and across as the Bulldogs came from behind to win. Goertzen, Steve Garret, Mike Terrell and three freshmen are expected to fill the backfield in the Oakland game. Sophomore Mike Quiletta will quarterback the Bulldog attack.

Defensively the Bulldogs lack the weight they had last year, but desire makes them a feared opponent again this year. The Oaker defense is reported stronger than in past seasons, though very little weight has been added in the line of coach Chuck Halseid's charges.

Leading Oakers
Bo Cannon is expected to lead the Oaker offensive attack playing from either the quarterback, a halfback or the fullback position. Alternating with Cannon at quarterback, the probable starting line-up is Jerry Rogers, filling up the backfield will be Jim Archer and Kerney Manley.

Wildcats' UVL Opener Friday

The mighty Wildcats of Glendale will travel to Clatskanie to take on the Pirates in a Umpqua Valley League contest Friday at 8 p.m.

For the Wildcats the clash with the Bucs will open UVL play, while the home team will have its first week losing a 4-7 decision to Myrtle Creek. Glendale goes into the game a strong favorite as a result of its 2-0 record in non-league play.

The Wildcats have scored 78 points in their first two outings, including a 30-0 win over Powers, while not being scored against. Glendale will be looking for its first win. The Pirates could play tough with Jerry Rogers and passing clicker.

Defense is Key
For the UVL favorites, the Wildcats, defense will probably be the keyword again this week as a veteran defensive team which has been rough thus far will start.

Offensively the Wildcats are strong with Doug Conlin handling the quarterbacking, Glen Fortune and Darrell Cellers working the halfback slot and Kyle Charon alternating with Marshall McCormack at the fullback position. Charon was named "back of the week" at Glendale for his performance in last week's game and Dick Reeve was named "line man of the week" for his outstanding work.

After having trouble last week on defense coach Leon Robison will have his Pirates up for Friday's game before the home fans. The Pirates have a strong group of lettermen back in line, and will try to fill some important spots vacated by seniors last year.

Offensive Attack
The offensive attack will be centered around Carl Burke and Robert Barry, a pair of three year lettermen. Also expected to see action in the backfield for Pirates will be Harold Estes, Dennis Standil and Hubert Stewart, along with quarterbacks Ace Bowden and Leon Smith.

Evergreen Football To Start Saturday

Football makes its 1961 bow in the Evergreen Conference Saturday with four of the six teams playing at home and all but two appearing in night gear. Opponents will represent three states and one Canadian province. Eastern Washington and Pacific Lutheran take to the road for night tussles. Eastern's Savages meet the Humboldt State team of Arcadia, Calif., which was one of the nation's best small college eleven last year.

The Lutes will head for Forest Grove, Ore., to tangle with Pacific University.

Northwest Rivalry
Central Washington and Whitman will clash at 2 p.m. in Ellensburg, and a 1:30 p.m. start is slated for the Tacoma meeting of Puget Sound and Willamette—the oldest inter-sectional rivalry in the Northwest.

Whitworth, favored to capture the conference title, will open in Spokane against Oregon Tech of Klamath Falls. The rivalry of British Columbia, a former member of the Evergreen circuit will meet Western Washington at Bellingham.

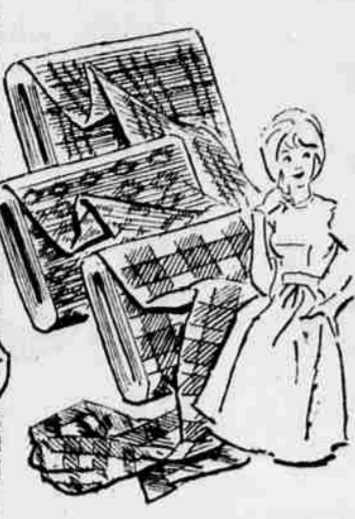

Irish Invade 'Trojanland'

The "fighting" Irish of Riddle will invade the home of the Douglas Trojans Saturday in search of their third straight victory and their second Umpqua Valley League win.

Game time at Douglas is set for 2 p.m.

Racing to two wins in as many starts the Irish have proved they are not to be counted out of the race for the UVL title. Riddle opened with a victory over Youngstown in non-league play, then a downed Oakland 2-1 to start in the local A-2 circuit. Douglas' record thus far is just reversed. The Trojans lost a lopsided non-league game to powerful Coquille to start the season before losing a heartbreaker 13-7 last week in UVL play to Sutherland.

Near Upper
Both teams are remembering the near upset last year, which saw Riddle come from behind on a length-of-the-field pass interception by Dave Weakley. Dave Weakley will not be in action this year, but the Trojans will still be fired up by the Irish.

Riddle has a smooth offensive unit with Ron Weakley engineering the drives. Don Fisher, an all-league choice last year, and Bill Markham give the Irish power from their halfback positions, while Gary and Leland Paetz are also expected to see action in the backfield.

Up front the Irish have a powerful forward wall led by tackle John Cassidy and Tom Roberts, guards Paul Griner and George Dawson and center Bill Newcomb. Keith Hanson, Tom Adis and Larry Ruckel add to the power in the line.

Young Team
Douglas fields a young team which should improve with each outing. Playing many freshmen and sophomores in each game the Trojans are expected to be tough towards the end of the season, and with few breaks could surprise several teams.

Probable starters in the backfield for the Trojans are quarterback Terry Peterson; halfbacks Larry Smith and Ricky Shafter; and fullback Floyd Meredith. Philip Daniels, Dennis Atherton, Ron Northart, Gordon McDowell and Bill Pailey will anchor the Douglas line.

Vikings, Bandon Set For Friday

The Myrtle Creek Vikings will take a break from Umpqua Valley League play Friday when they take another crack at coastal A-2 power in the form of the Bandon team.

Kickoff time at Myrtle Creek is set for 8 p.m. as the Vikings are at home for the third straight week.

Myrtle Creek tested the power of the Sunset Six League in its opener, and fell 33-7 before the on-rushing Myrtle Point Bobcats, currently rated number two in the state in A-2 competition. Last week the Vikings bounced back with a 45-7 win over Glendale in their UVL opener.

Impressive Record
Bandon has an impressive record thus far this season having defeated Sutherland 52-0 and Toledo 26-0. Bandon, also rated well up in the top ten A-2 teams, is one of the few teams in the state that hasn't been scored on as defense promises to play a big part in Friday's clash.

The Vikings had trouble moving the ball in their opener and suffered from a bad case of fumbles. Coach LeRoy Juelke worked out many kinks before the Glendale game, and the Vikings exhibited the power expected of them. For Friday's contest Juelke will have his crew ready to punt heads with the coastal powerhouses.

Leading offensive chargers for the Vikings are Ken Graf and Jim Byrd. Byrd came through with 177 yards last week in nine carries, with Graf engineering the drives and setting up Byrd for the long runs.

With plenty of power and speed in the backfield it is still the Viking line that worries most of the Myrtle Creek opponents. Mike Shircliff, Duane Redwine and Bill Raeborn combine to give the Vikings a huge forward wall by A-2 standards, and when they combine their rushing power with that of Jerry Wilson the Myrtle Creek line becomes a deadly weapon.
