Mrs. Walter Cook, membership chairman, and her assistants are currently contacting local residents in the annual membership drive.

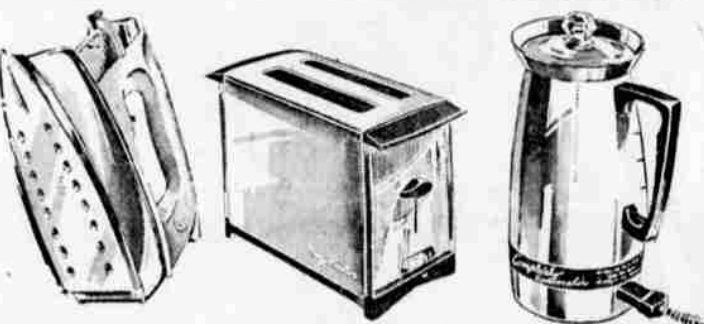
Hunting Trip Made

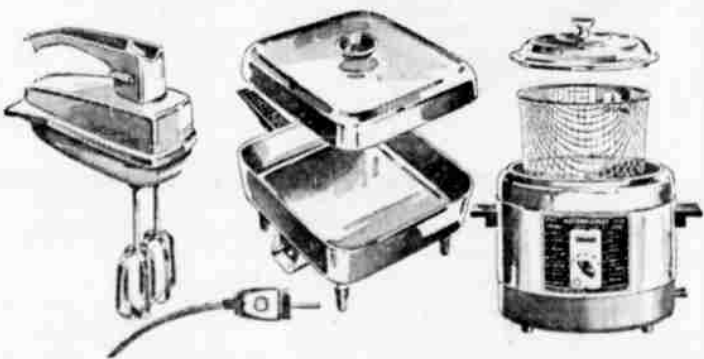
